Dear Christian Friends;

Once again it is time for a Quarterly Report from this District, which includes the Stations down at Hartland and up at Calvary in additon to Paulpietersburg.

It is good to be able to report definite progress for a change, rather than discouraging things. Instead of merely "holding our own", which is quite a task sometimes, the Lord has blessed His work in a positive way, giving some new Seekers, and other Signs of Revival. Praise His Name.

After a period of 3 months under discipline, the Native Elder at Hartland has been restored to his Position and Responsibilities. The Local Workers recommended that the Native Alliance Executive Committee be called, so Rev. Charles Sanders and myself, together with three other Ministers went down for an afternoon Session. It turned out to be longer than planned, as we got home for supper at 10 P.M., but well worth the effort. Only a week ago I took Rev. Methula (the one disciplined) with me to visit an Outpost, and he preached with Divine Unction and Power.

We also had a Meeting of the Local Workers at Hartland recently, and reorganized the entire area; appointing two new Licensed Preachers to their Outposts, arranging for regular Class Meetings at each place, organizing one new Sunday School, and laying the basis for better understanding and fuller cooperation among the Workers themselves.

The prospects for the Clinic reopening by Dec. 1st are very good, as we seem to have found a Nurse with the needed Academic and Spiritual qualifications. She is a Swazi, belonging to a Norwegian Mission Church. I am taking a local Doctor down to Hartland this week in order to gain his advice as to the best possible use of the facilities and equipment available.

There was a Workers' Meeting up at Calvary a week ago, and one Lay Preacher, who has shown signs of backsliding and laziness, was "interviewed". Pray for this man, that he will take the firm stand he needs to take within his own home, as he must either remove the reproach he has brought upon the Church or we will be minus one our text, "and so is also the Holy Ghost whom.redaenqh Yesterday was a "red letter day" for our Preacher here in the Paulpietersburg Location, as he arranged for a bus to take a full load of Sunday School children to the town of Dundee, 80 miles away, for a Rally.

We also attended the Rally, but only after visiting a family who has moved from Calvary to the Bantustan bordering on Dundee. There was a real down-pour of rain Friday, Saturday and Sunday, but nobody's enthusiasm was dampened a bit, though the gravel roads were a frightful mess. Fortunately, most of the driving was on a tarred road, otherwise the Rally and the visit to the new Outpost would have been cancelled. There was a large and enthusiastic crowd at the Rally, held in a School Auditorium, and the Program lasted from 10 A.M. to 5 P.M. The Lessons and Demonstrations were over by the time we arrived in the afternoon, but the Special Singing was very nice. The small group at Dundee seemed delighted with the effort made by our local Church, and our Sunday School children had a wonderful time.
