
### AMHERST CHURCH DEDICATION



History was made for the Amherst Reformed Baptist Church on Tuesday, September 12 when a new and beautiful sanctuary was dedicated "For the hallowing of family life, for teaching and guiding the young, for the perfecting of the saints, for the conversion of sinners, for the promotion of righteousness, for the extension of the kingdom of God."

The pulpit was bedecked with baskets of flowers and an overflow audience filled the sanctuary. Present in the service were eleven ministers. Brother Cedric Landers sang "Bless This House" and "Built on a Rock." Rev. G. A. Inman read Scripture, Rev. B. M. Hicks offered the Prayer of Dedication, and Rev. R. G. Morehouse read the Church Covenant.

Greetings were brought to the Amherst Church from the Amherst Ministerial Association, Trinity St. Stephen's United Church, the Amherst Town Council, the District Church of the Nazarene, and other Reformed Baptist Churches.

Rev. M. W. Bagley, pastor of the church, led the congregation in the Act of Dedication. He also extended a welcome to two new members.

Alliance Superintendent Rev. H. R. Ingersoll preached the Dedication Sermon, using as a basis Psalm 122:1. Rev. J. A. Stevens pronounced the benediction.

### Dr. H. Orton Wiley Passes of Table Bris

Dr. H. Orton Wiley, retired Nazarene elder, died on Tuesday, August 22, in a hospital in Pasadena, California, at the age of eighty-three.

Dr. Wiley was considered to be the dean of Nazarene theologians, having written and lectured extensively over a period of fifty years. He was recognized beyond the boundaries of his own Church as an astute thinker and an outstanding Christian scholar.

In the death of Dr. Wiley, the Church has suffered the loss of a godly man and one of its strongest exponents of the Arminian and Wesleyan position.
