Dear Young People:

Greetings to my friends at home. I desire to give my testimony at this time. During the months of July and August I held meetings in a school house and worked on a farm in Quebec. During that time and since I have felt the burden of David Livingstone's prayer, "Lord, grant me strength to suffer and willingness to serve."

Jesus said in reference to His life, "I lay down my life for the sheep. And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold; them also I must bring . . . no man taketh my life from me, but I lay it down of myself. I have power to lay it down and I have power to take it again."
