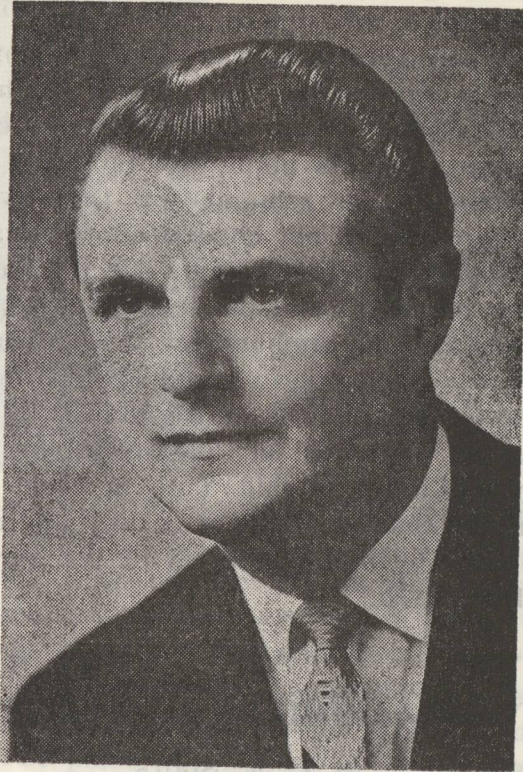


RE-ELECTED SUPERINTENDENT

With a nearly unanimous vote, Rev. H. R. Ingersoll was re-elected on the first ballot to a two-year term as Superintendent of the Reformed Baptist Church at the Friday morning session of Alliance at Beulah Camp.

1962 Alliance Action

At the opening session of Alliance, held on Wednesday, July 4, Rev. B. C. Cochrane was elected Camp President. Other Alliance officers were elected as follows: Vice-President, Rev. M. W. Bagley, Recording Secretary, Rev. L. K. Mullen, Assistant Secretary, Rev. S. E. Cameron, Corresponding Secretary, Rev. G. B. Bridgeo, Treasurer, Rev. N. E. Trafton, Assistant Treasurer, Rev. G. R. Symonds, Auditor, Harold K. Ingersoll.

Alliance greetings were wired to our missionaries and church people of South Africa and Rhodesia, and also to the Sterritt sisters, Hartland, N. B., who were unable to be in attendance at Beulah this year.

Recommendations, made to Alliance by a committee on "Procedures and Appointments" appointed in 1961, were adopted as follows:

- (1) That all delegates be asked to register, previous to the opening of Alliance, between 1:30 and 2:00 p.m.
- (2) That Alliance sessions be limited to the hours of 9-11 a.m., 2-4 p.m., and 7:30-9 p.m.
- (3) That the last regular session of Alliance be held on the Friday afternoon previous to the opening of Camp Meeting.
- (4) That Alliance delegates be on time at all sessions, leaving only by permission of the chair.
- (5) That all Alliance Boards meet either during the month of May or June for the purpose of preparing any changes or recommendations to be presented at Alliance.

Recommendations, needing more study and preparation by the committee, will be presented to Alliance next year.

Alliance gave approval to September 30 being considered a denominational "Roll Call" Sunday for all Sunday Schools, and that the month of November be a denomination-wide Sunday School contest month.

Important changes, relative to the organization and operation of Riverside Camp, were given Alliance approval. One key recommendation was as follows: "That a yearly business meeting, consisting of pastors, ordained elders, and three delegates from each church, be held during Riverside Camp, at which time camp personnel shall be appointed, and matters of business pertaining to the operation and maintenance of the camp shall be transacted. These meetings shall be called and chaired by the Alliance Superintendent, unless otherwise arranged by him."

Alliance gave approval to an increase of the Bethany Bible College budget from \$9,000. to \$12,000. for the year 1962-63. Other budgets will remain as they were for the church year 1961-62.

At a special session of the Alliance, called for 9 a.m. Wednesday, July 11, recommendations from the Combined Boards, Alliance Executive and Bethany Bible College Board, having been received in the previous session as notice of motion, were presented to Alliance. The first recommendation, to relocate Bethany Bible College at Sussex, New Brunswick, was lost by Alliance vote. Other recommendations, pertaining to a proposed building and financing, were not voted on.

Alliance authorized the installation of fire extinguishers in all Beulah dormitories.

Two recommendations were received from the committee for The King's Highway and were adopted by Alliance.

- (1) That Rev. L. K. Mullen serve as Editor and Business Manager of The King's Highway for the year 1962-63.
- (2) That the issues of July 15 and August 15 be discontinued annually, beginning with the August 15 issue of this year.

Rev. H. R. Ingersoll, Alliance Superintendent and Chairman of all Alliance sessions, gave excellent leadership and guidance in the conduct of Alliance business. The business agenda was followed throughout with only minor changes and adjustments.
