BETHANY BEGINS PROMISING YEAR

The school doors swung open at Bethany Bible College on September 19th, starting the school's eighteenth year of operation. Fifty-four students enrolled in this year's student body, the smallest number in the last four years—but still an above-average enrollment.

Several factors contributed to a decreased enrollment. One was a more selective admission policy. Another was the discontinuation of grade twelve, the senior matriculation course. Yet another factor was the drop in enrollment in Yarmouth students, particularly in the buisness department. In the end, the on-campus enrollment is practically the same as last year's

The most heartening factor about this year's student body, and certainly the most important, is the generally high calibre of the students. The new students (mostly making up grade ten, commercial and first-year college) appear to be one of the best entering groups in recent years.

Speaking of the Bible department, Mr. Stairs commented, "All in all, the first-year Bible class is the best in my recent experience." These students are well qualified academically, purposeful, and—for their ages—spiritually mature. Even larger colleges might do well to find as much calibre and challenge in their larger classes.

The new year has started with considerable smoothness and the students are adjusting well to the discipline of a Christian boarding school. If our "reading" is accurate, moral is at a good level. New girls and boys are heard to say after a month, "I love it."

Perhaps some improvements have contributed to this favourable state of affairs. The arriving students found the campus and dormitories "looking up," for painting, cleaning, and general preparations for opening were more extensive and adequate this year. To mention a few improvements, each girl's room was painted (walls and woodwork) and a floor covering was provided for each room (including five new coverings). The girls' bathroom was literally transformed by a new cabinet around the sinks, coral-coloured Barker-tile all around the walls and cabinet, a new ceiling, and two coats of white enamel paint—fit for the fussiest now. Former students, of course, can appreciate the changes most of all. The students also found that action had been taken to provide a better weekly indoor recreational program, a students' common room, and better music facilities and equipment.

"For what has been done to make life more enjoyable for the students we expect a return in student response and cooperation," Mr Stairs stated. "So far we have been getting it. This promises to be a very worthwhile year."
