#### LIGHTED UP INSIDE

The other day my seven-year-old daughter came to me and whispered in my ear, "Daddy, I've been praying in my room and I feel all lighted up inside." My immediate delight was two-fold: first, that my child loved the Lord; second, that a basic spiritual truth had been experienced and had found expression in the simple language of a child.

Prayer . . . and then the "inner glow"! Here is the solution to a lifeless testimony, a dead pulpit, or a dying church. Here is the secret to the Christian's victory and the advance of the Church. Here is God's method of saving the lost, reaching the unenlightened, and advancing the kingdom.

For men with "burning hearts," lit by the fire of the Holy Ghost, have literally turned the world upside down. It is they who through the centuries have challenged the strongholds of darkness and have prevailed against them. Whether Moses or St. Paul, Savonarola or Madame Guyon, Brainerd or Whitefield, Wesley or Knox, Carey or Livingstone—all knew the secret of an "inner glow;" all were wrought in the fires of affliction, and all helped to revolutionize the generation in which they lived.
