and in a spiritual outreach to our patients.

Our new laundry and drug store room unit has now been completed except for some additional laundry plumbing. What a pleasure to have sufficient shelving for the systematic storing of our medicines, equipment, and other medical supplies. A new 3-room annex to our Nurses' Residence is now completed for occupancy with the exception of thatching the roof. A corrugated metal house for our native pastor and hospital evangelist is presently being thatched. Our new 10 kv. lighting plant powered by a large diesel engine is now installed and running smoothly affording ample lighting of the hospital and mission. Plans are now under way for the installation of stand-by emergency lighting of the hospital for use when the generator is not running. Our next step in this direction should be the installing of X-ray equipment. I have sent several slide pictures of these more recent developments to Eric and Nina Haywood.

We wish to thank the many who have prayed and those who have given of their funds during the very critical period of water shortage at Bethesda. We are deeply thankful to the Lord to be able to report that our borehole has a good yield, additional pumping has been purchased, piping has been laid, and sufficient water is again running into our reservoir tanks.

Space will not permit me to elaborate on spiritual victories in our medical work, although they thrill our hearts and are the reason for our being here. I would like to mention briefly a very elderly African who was admitted to Bethesda Hospital several months ago. He told us on admission that he had been an African doctor and, desparing of his own remedies, he had insisted that his family bring him to the hospital. Diagnostic studies quickly confirmed a suspicion of incurable disease. As we confronted him with the sadness of this news, how happy we were to be able to tell him the glad news of salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. He eagerly listened and readily prayed with us that the Lord would forgive him and receive him for Jesus' sake. He then testified to us of the peace of salvation in his heart. A few days later he passed away. A death bed repentance, perhaps, but few of these people have had the religious opportunities which we have had in our Christian land.

Many times in our missionary work, we are conscious of happenings which could only be the result of the moving of God's hands in answer to prayer. Your faithful prayer support is paying dividends and we praise God for them; we urge your continuance.

We praise the Lord for the imminent arrival of the Hudsons to our Rhodesian Field and suggest that you especially pray for them in regard to the adjustments they will have to make to a ministry in a new land, among new customs, and in a new language.
