Rev. A. D. Cann, pastor, Black's Harbour, N. B., attended Summer Sessions at Winona Lake School of Theology Winona Lake, Indian. At Commencement exercises, held on Friday, August 24, at Winona Lake, the degree of Bachelor of Arts was conferred upon Mr. Cann. This achievement is the more outstanding when it is noted that all of Mr. Cann's work at Winona Lake was done during Summer Sessions.

Rev. W. C. Burbury, pastor Old Town, Maine, attended Summer School at the University of Maine where he is currently a candidate for the degree of Bachelor of Arts. Mr. Burbury's courses included language studies and psychology. He plans to continue studies at the University of Maine during the second semester of this year.

Rev. Gary Lyons, pastor Hartland, N. B. circuit of churches, was a student at Olivet Nazarene College Summer Session, Kankakee, Illinois. Mr. Lyons took courses in history, sociology, and speech, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Theology.
