DR. DAVID E. WILSON PASSES

Dr. David E. Wilson, 70, outstanding holiness evangelist for forty-five years in eighty-five different denominations and societies, passed away unexpectedly at the home of his daughter in Owosso, Michigan, on the evening of January 17, 1963.

Dr. Wilson made his home in Binghamton, New York, and for the greater part of his life served as a general evangelist of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. He was known far and wide among the churches of his own denomination and his ministry extended to many other churches across the nation and around the world.

He will be remembered among Reformed Baptists for his ministry at Beulah (1944), at Riverside (1947), and in several of our individual churches.

Surviving are his wife, one son, one daughter, three brothers and one sister.
