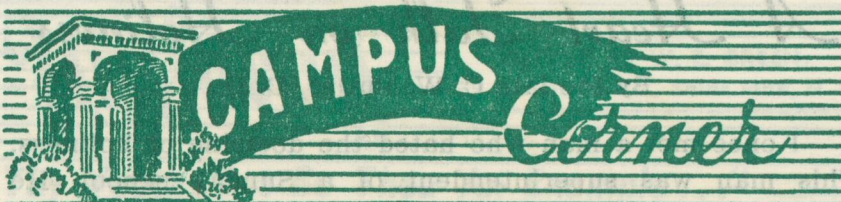

Blessings On Thee, Little Bulletin

On Wednesday of this week, November 27, fifteen hundred copies of our Christmas bulletin went into the mails to make their ways to friends near and far.

This mailing marked the completion of a sizeable undertaking. The preparation of the mailing list (revised yearly), the securing of supplies involving five pieces for each individual mailing (a combined total of 7,500 pieces) the writing of messages, the arranging of written materials, the cutting of three stencils with decorative work, doing three "runs" on a hand-operated Gestetner, the addressing of envelopes and stamping, the stuffing of envelopes—all these jobs together constituted the preparation of the Christmas bulletin.

As we sent the bulletin on its way, we had some special feeling for it. Perhaps our sentiments could be expressed thus: "Blessings on thee, little bulletin."
