We have just completed our first month of Radio Broadcasting. Letters from our listeners have been encouraging and helpful. A lady writes from Digby Co, N. S. saying she feels that the program will do a lot of good. A Layman from Shelburne Co, N. S., says they receive the Broadcast loud and clear in his community. A Pastor from Charlotte Co., N. B., expresses appreciation for the program telling us his congregation listens in to it every Sunday. We have received telephone calls from people in St. John, as well as being stopped on the street by people who hear the message Sunday by Sunday.

Receipts for the month of November totaled \$263. Our expenses were \$100. This is a larger amount for expenses than we would normally encounter in a month, because of added expense in getting the program started. Radio time is \$15.50 per week. We do not anticipate that our monthly expenditure will go beyond \$70, excepting of course when there are 5 Sundays in a month. We might add that all donations are Income Tax Free.

We would encourage you to pray for this effort. Our venture to reach the public by Radio was born out of a passion for the multitudes inside as well as outside of the boundaries of the Church, who need the Saving and Sanctifying Grace of God. We can only speak; it must be the Spirit that will take the Word and reveal the Truth of it to the people.

Thank you for being a part of this work. Together we can do much to further the Cause of the Gospel. Tell your friends about the Broadcast and urge them to listen.

The revival services began on Wednesday evening, October 2, and continued through Rally Day, October 13. Our hearts were stirred as we listened to the many thrilling experiences Mr. Whipple has had in winning souls to Christ. Many found Christ around our altar and others dedicated themselves anew to the task of soul winning.

An average of nine teams went calling four nights during the meeting and seven people stayed at the church to pray. Mt. Zion is located between Thomasville and Lexington so maps were secured of these two towns. The teams were surprised to learn that out of the 228 homes visited, there were 123 prospective families for the Mt. Zion Church.

Rally Day goals were set for 425 in attendance and \$1,000 in the offering. God honored our efforts and helped us go beyond our goals with 450 present for Rally Day and \$1,061.21 in the offering.

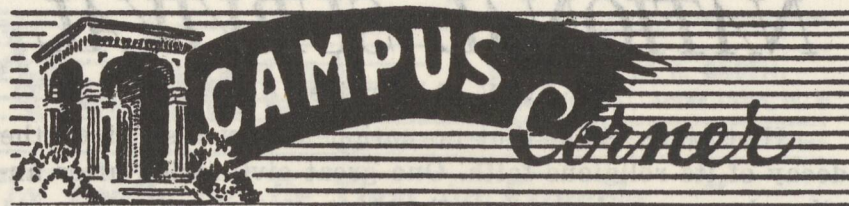
