DRINKING AND DRIVING

Within the area in the Province of Alberta which falls within R. C. M. P. jurisdiction we had 193 fatal accidents in 1961, in which 238 persons were killed. In 1962 these figures rose from 193 fatal accidents to 203 and the number of persons killed rose from 238 to 247. As of yesterday, November 19, fatal accidents reached a total of 179 accidents with 240 people killed so far this year. What Part Does Liquor Play In These Deaths?—of the 193 fatal accidents which occurred in 1961, our records indicate liquor was involved in 60, and of the 203 fatal accidents in 1962 liquor was found to be a factor in 96. This year out of 179 fatal accidents to date liquor was found to be involved in 79, and we still have a month and a half to go until the end of 1963.
