The following resolution, to be sent to the Premier of N.B. and the members of his cabinet, was passed unanimously by Alliance concerning the Lord's Day Act:

Under deep conviction that the preservation of the sanctity of the Lord's Day is vital to the life of our homes, communities and our Nation, we earnestly petition the officials of government and members of the Legislature

to consider the revision of the Lord's Day Act only by conscientious adherence to the standards of Scripture and the highest standards of Christian democracy.

We appeal for recognition of a twenty-four hour Lord's Day observance, from midnight Saturday until midnight Sunday, and request that all laws pertaining to the Day apply to the entire twenty-four hour period.

We further appeal for strict and impartial enforcement of the law against all unnecessary trade and commerce on the Lord's Day and a statutory ban on all commercialized sport and entertainment.

We pray that decisions of constitutional authorities will be based upon responsible concern for the physical, moral and spiritual welfare of our people, rather than in response to the appeals of those who would use the Lord's Day for pleasure and profit.

It is the desire and hope of our Alliance that the original and God-ordained intent of the Lord's Day be honoured, namely, that it be for all our people a time for physical rest and spiritual worship.

Alliance approved a resolution calling for the minimum salary of pastors to be raised from \$1,500. to \$2,500. Needed funds for supplements are to be raised by a separate Church budget of \$5,000. administered by the Treasurer of the Allance.
