## OTHER ITEMS OF INTEREST

Our Young People's Association has been supporting our Evangelical Holiness Bible School in South Africa through our Self Denial Fund. At our Annual Meeting the Association voted to continue this support.

Our treasurer's report indicated that the self denial receipts were down slightly from receipts last year. It is hoped that local and district presidents will boost the self denial project for the coming year.

While several societies did not file a report, it is significant that the total membership and average attendance is down from that of last year. In spite of this the amount of money raised exceeded that of last year with the same number of societies reporting.

... A special note of interest is the Digby Young People's Society report. This society was organized in one of our Home Mission Churches in September 1963. This new society has a membership of 28 with an average attendance of 20. At one of their programmes there were 115 people present. This should be encouraging to each of our young people's society. We are sure that you want to congratulate them and pray for their continued success.
