Alliance appointed Rev. N. E. Trafton as editor of The King's Highway, replacing Rev. L. K. Mullen who has been the editor for the past three years. Alliance also approved a change in the Highway format, reducing the Highway from eight pages to four, with publication once per month. The subscription rate is to be \$2.00 per year. Those who have paid in advance, beyond six months, will have their subscription extended on the basis of the new rate. The first issue of the new Highway will appear in early September. The change in Highway size and number of issues was necessitated by increased cost of publication.

Rev. H. R. Ingersoll, who has served as Alliance Superintendent for the past four years, was re-elected for a two-year term on the first ballot.

The nominating committee appointed to submit names at 1965 Alliance for vacancies in Alliance Boards: Rev. B. C. Cochrane, Rev. S. W. Ingersoll, Rev. H. B. Ricker, Mr. John Henry, Mr. Douglas MacCallum.

Rev. W. L. Fernley, Chairman of the Board of Bethany Bible College, reported a total of \$98,770. as having been received in cash and pledges toward the cost of building a new Bethany at Sussex, N. B. The ground-breaking ceremony was announced for Sept. 12, with the opening of the new School in September of 1965. The contractor for the job is Mr. Joe McDowell, Grand Harbour, N. B.

Alliance directed the Superintendent to visit the Churches during the fall for the purpose of sharing with them information on matters of Church union.
