### ALL ROADS LEAD TO SUSSEX SEPTEMBER 12

September the twelfth will be a historic day for Reformed Baptists as they witness the sod-turning ceremony for the new Bethany Bible College. The re-location and building program has been the largest denominational project ever undertaken by our people. As the program enters its final phase, our people have reason to rejoice in what has been achieved under God and for the glory of His name.

The sod-turning ceremony will take place on the site at three o'clock on Saturday afternoon, when our Moncton choir will lead the congregation in praise. Special music will be provided by the Gospel Trio of Fred-

erickton. The various parts of the service—scripture reading, prayer, the act of sod turning—will be conducted by our church leaders and school officials. Greetings will be brought by Hon. Henry G. Irwin, Minister of Education, Mr. George Horton, M.L.A. for Kings County, and Mayor Dean of Sussex. The benediction will be pronounced by the President of the Kings County Ministerial Association.

Other parts of the afternoon program are in the state of planning at the time of this writing. Every consideration is being given to make the event significant and inspirational. Above all, God's blessing is coveted to make the occasion a means of testimony and witness—a proper Christian beginning of a new institution in a new location.

Our people will not want to miss this event. Many are planning to travel long distances to be present. A large company of our people with the spirit of worship upon them will make the kind of witness that belongs to such a venture.
