

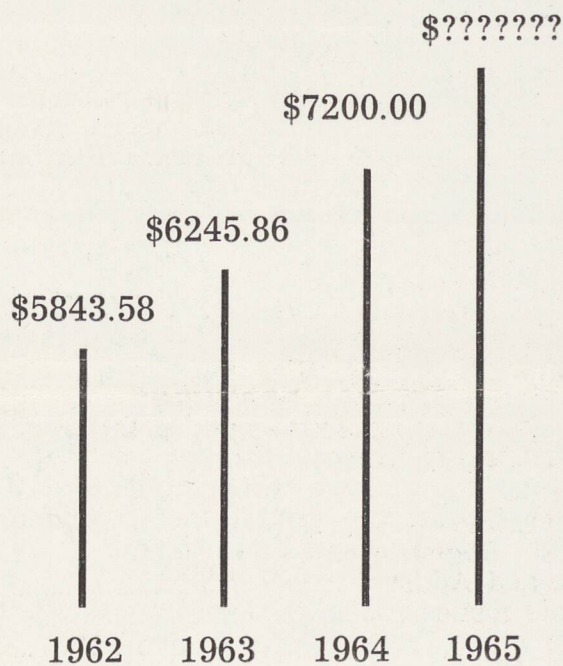
## FOREIGN MISSIONS
