Alliance appointed a committee on Moral and Social Action, said committee to be authorized to speak through the year for the Alliance on issues which may arise. Committee: Rev. B. C. Cochrane, Rev. N. E. Trafton, Rev. L. K. Mullen.

Alliance endorsed a small assessment for each local church for the support of denominational Sunday School promotion. The rate of assessment is \$1. for Sunday Schools under 50, \$2. for Schools under 100, and \$3. for school over 100.

Approved a motion authorizing denominational Sunday School Supplies to be handled by the Bethany Book Room, Sussex, N. B.

Approved the following budget allocations for the current church year.
