Greetings from the Perth Reformed Baptist Church! A letter is long overdue from my pen. Almost a year has elapsed in our new field of service. It was with mixed feelings that we left our "faithful flock" at Woods Harbour. We do praise God for them and publicly thank them for the wonderful support that they gave to us while being their pastor.

We arrived at Perth with a burning desire to work for the Lord. The challenge before us was a wonderful opportunity for service. For a number of years our Perth Church wanted to have a new location for their church. At the time of our arrival, the United Baptist Church had been closed for a year. It seemed feasible for us to negotiate with them for their property. I wish that space would permit to tell you about many of the highlights of the business transactions. It was wonderful because God was in it. On April the second we had the papers signed over to our Alliance and paid the United Baptist people \$6,000. The Lord enabled us to raise \$4,000 and all we need now is \$2,000. We are looking to the Lord for the remainder between now and re-dedication. The tentative dates for the "Big Day" are May 20, 1965.

We have been indeed grateful to the Perth United Baptist congregation for their co-operation and sacrifice in permitting us to have their property. Financially we could have never paid them the actual value of the building. We praise the Lord that it was a spiritual transaction and not a business one.

It has been a pleasure to be the Pastor of our church in Perth. Our people have been so faithful and generous to us. Our only desire is that we will be able to repay them in some way of service.

The spiritual progress in our congregation is encouraging but we need a mighty Holy Ghost Revival.
