### RHODESIAN MISSIONARIES

#### REMAIN AT THEIR POST

Rev. Nbokazi accompanied our Superintendent, Rev. Glendon Kierstead to Rhodesia for the Missionary Conference, December, 12-15. His ministry to the African Church in this time of tension proved most helpful. He was well accepted and good results followed. Our Superintendent reports in his letter dated December 22nd, 1965 that the atmosphere in Rhodesia is tense. Prices are rising fast and rations are being imposed on some goods.

Mr. Kierstead further reports that he inquired from police and other Government offices and from all that he could learn there seems to be no reason to move the missionaries at present. He writes— "We are indeed passing through one of the most difficult periods in our history. We need your unfailing prayers."

According to missions executives in London, missionaries are remaining at their posts in Rhodesia and will continue to do so.
