

perienced the presence of the Holy Spirit as I did that morning. Throughout the entire debate God seemed so near. Every word spoken was so sincere and clearly expressed. When our Superintendent called us to vote, I felt a peace sweep over me and over that entire assembly that was both real and wonderful. It seemed as though God were saying, 'I am pleased with what you are doing.' It was indeed an historic and memorable moment. When the debating ended and the question was called, 152 ballots were cast, 128 of which supported merger with the Wesleyan Methodist Church. In other words, 84.2 per cent favored uniting with a people who are in so many ways "Our kind of people." It remains now for the legal procedures to be carried out, and the departments of our churches to become integrated. It is expected that this will take upwards of one year to complete. Meanwhile, September 25 has been designated as the day we change our church bulletin boards and declare ourselves as Wesleyan Methodists.

World history has had its unsung heroes. Church history also has had labourers who have worked unnoticed, tirelessly promoting the work of God. Merle Smith, retiring denominational Youth President, and Douglas MacCallum, retiring Vice-President, are two men whose dedication to the cause of youth should not go unsung. Many people have not been aware of the energy and time these men have spent in the interest of youth. They are two good reasons why God has been blessing and expanding our youth work.
