HOME MISSION REPORT-YARMOUTH

Regular Services were resumed in the Crosby Memorial Chapel immediately after Beulah Camp, and held there until Easter Sunday. Attendance at the services and interest in our Church held steady through the fall and winter, and the faithful financial support given is worthy of note.

We had planned to move the Chapel approx. one hundred yards and continue using it for another year, (through the courtesy of the new owners of the old Bethany property), but after thorough investigation it was decided to sell it and rent elsewhere. The sills and floor were rotted badly, and the building was made by joining together two old buildings back in 1949.

We have retained and are using our own pews, pulpit, piano, etc. in a rented hall on Main St., just across from the County Jail. It is upstairs, but gives more floor space than the old Chapel. First services were held April 17th., and we expect to be there for fifteen months.

In accordance with Home Mission Board decisions, we have made an offer to purchase the Central United Church. (The Ministers' Conference was held there in
