The following Tuesday they were back to the mission again, asking for Dr. Emmett or Mr. Hudson. Neither of these men were present so Mrs. Hudson asked if she

Simon said: "Well Mrs. Hudson we know something happened to us last week, but we don't understand just what." Mrs. Hudson replied: "Do you know if your sins have been forgiven, do you know where you would spend eternity, if you were to die today?" They were uncertain how to answer the question.
