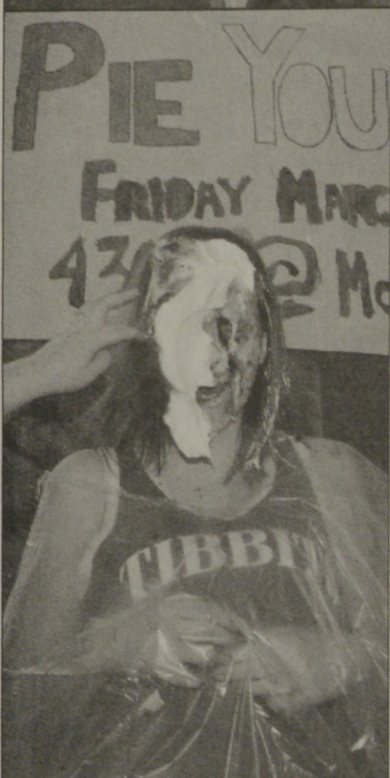
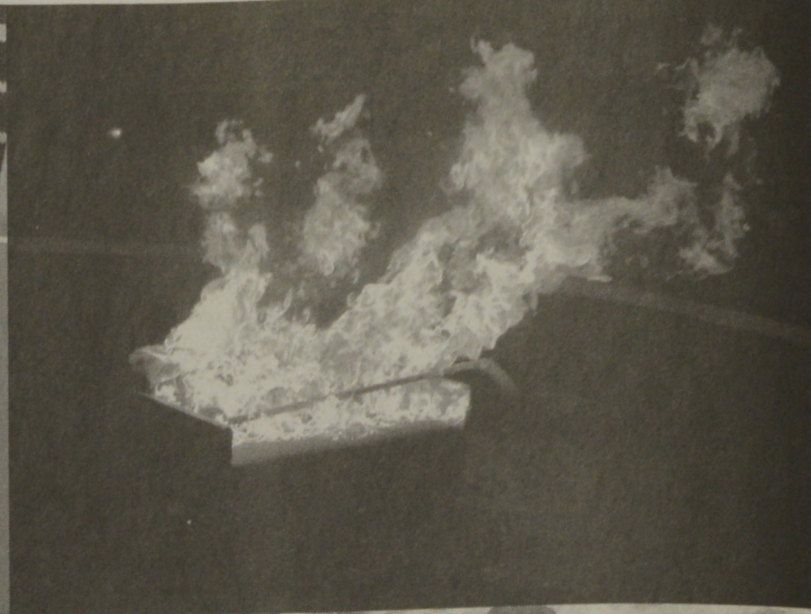


Raise a Little Hell raises \$20,000

Last Friday, March 30th, there was a little bit of hair on the floor of McConnell Hall.

Neill House held its annual charity event and house social, Raise a Little Hell, there on Friday. Hundreds of residents from the community came out to pie their leaders and proctors, and to see residents from Neill and the rest of the community have their heads shaved.

The event ended with two Neill residents, Karen Nabuurs and Laura Kaderly, having their heads shaved. UNB student Alicia Chisholm also had her head shaved at the beginning of the evening.

Dustin Eisenhour, President of Neill for the upcoming year, had a big

part in putting together the event. "It took a lot," he says, "but was definitely worth it. It was our biggest event of the year. We took weeks to prepare and arrange all the people involved and all the aspects."

The house committee took care of most of the preparing, he says, but the house participated in things like the tin foiling and painting the halls of the residence to make the atmosphere as hellish as possible.

The event consisted of more than just the head shaving event. It began on Thursday when the residents of Neill lined all the hallways with tin foil, to be painted the next morning. Preparations -- and celebrations -- started early the next morning. After the head shave, a couch was burned as usual in the DKT parking lot, followed by a social in the house.

"I'm really happy with how it went," says Eisenhour. "Just seeing from last year, how it went, we tried to build on that. I was happy with how it went off and how smooth it went, and how good of a time everyone had. And how much money we raised."

Going in, he says, the house was shy of their goal of \$20,000 for the year to donate to the Canadian Cancer Society. But with proctor/leader pieing and head shaving, that goal managed to be achieved. The presentation of the cheque will be made in the near future, possibly during the Last Class Festival concert at the SUB.

Karen Nabuurs was one of the three women to have her head shaved at the event.

"Jil Cormier inspired both Laura and I last year to shave our heads," she explains, "and we wanted to help Neill House reach its \$20,000 goal."

She and Laura Kaderly combined managed to bring in over \$1500 for the cause.

As for her new haircut, she says that "I felt really overwhelmed because there was so much attention that goes along with it. But I felt really good for doing it, and very supported by the rest of the house."

She says she's adjusting to her new style fairly well.

"I love the convenience of it. It takes virtually no time to get ready in the morning, which is pretty sweet. I'm not missing it yet."

Nabuurs says she's excited to try new styles as the hair grows back in. But would she do it again?

"I think this'll probably be a one time thing, but I don't regret doing it."

Dustin Eisenhour also shaved his head. Though he lived in Neill last year, this is his first time doing it for the cause.

He says that he chose to shave his head this year partly because of coming into the president's role.

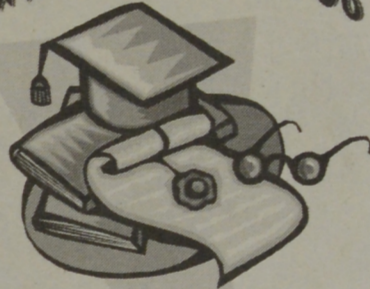
