Seventy-nine American ships visited the island of Tahiti during the year, 1840, the tonnage of which amounted to 56,975 tons.

From Bicknell's Reporter we learn that the depreciation in the aggregate value of the stock of twenty institutions in Philadelphia, the bank of the United States included, amounts for the last three years, to upwards of 56,000,000 dollars.

An effort is making in Charleston to establish a line of steam packets between that city and England. The Charleston Mercury says the subscription is fast filling up.

A Cincinnati paper of the 31st ult., says that large quantities of copper ore have been discovered in the vicinity of Wheeling, which upon analysis proved to be pure. Its basis appeared to be carbonate of lime, and it is supposed must exist in great abundance.

The manufacture of salt is now successfully prosecuted at Grand Rapids, Mich: from water obtained by boring at the depth of near 700 feet from the surface of the earth.

Gov. Seward has issued a proclamation offering a reward of seven hundred and fifty dollars to any one who shall give information resulting in the conviction, either in this State or in New Jersey, of any person guilty of the violation and murder of Mary C. Rogers.

New Orleans papers of the 28th ult. shew the progress of the Yellow Fever for the two days preceding, viz: on the 26th there were 23 deaths, of which 10 were by the fever. There were 13 admissions to the Charity Hospital, and 2 deaths by fever.
