



At a Common Council,
Held at the CITY-HALL of the City of
SAINT JOHN, on the Twenty-eighth day
of APRIL, in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and fourteen, and
in the fifty-fourth year of His Majesty's
Reign—

READ AND ENACTED THE FOLLOWING
LAWS.

**A Law to regulate the size of
Fish Barrels, and the appoint-
ment of Inspectors thereof with-
in the City of Saint John.**

I. Be it ordained by the Mayor,
*Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of Saint
John, in Common Council convened,* That from
and after the passing of this Law, all Barrels
made for the purpose of putting up Pickled
Fish of any description whatsoever (Salmon
excepted) within the City of Saint John,
and all Barrels which shall be brought into
the said City for the purpose aforesaid, shall
be so made as to contain twenty-eight gallons
wine measure, and shall be made of staves
sound and free from rot and black or red ro-
ten sap, not less than twenty-eight inches in
length, and half an inch in thickness at the
bilge, and three quarters of an inch in thick-
ness at the chine, and shall be full hooped,
that is two-thirds of the Barrel covered with
hoops, and shall have the heads made of pro-
per stuff rived for the purpose, and not less
than three quarters of an inch in thickness,
and also sound and free from rot or sap.

II. And be it further ordained, That there
shall be appointed within the said City, two
or more Inspectors of Fish Barrels of the said
City, each of whom shall find good and suffi-
cient security in the sum of Two Hundred
Pounds for the faithful discharge of his duty,
and shall be also sworn to the faithful dis-
charge thereof.

III. And be it further ordained, That all
Barrels which shall be made in the said City
of Saint John for the purpose of packing or
putting up Pickled Fish of any description
(Salmon excepted) and all Barrels which shall
be brought into the said City for the pur-
pose aforesaid, before they or any of them
shall be sold or offered for sale, shall be duly
inspected and branded by one of the Inspec-
tors of Barrels herein before mentioned to be
appointed; and in case any such Barrel shall
be sold or offered for sale not having been so
inspected or branded, the person or persons
who shall buy, sell, or offer to sell any such
Barrel not having been so first inspected and
branded, shall for each and every Barrel so
bought, sold or offered for sale, forfeit and
pay the sum of THREE SHILLINGS, one
moiety of which penalty shall be paid to the
person who will give information of the of-
fence.

IV. And be it further ordained, That if
any person or persons shall as an Inspector of
Barrels brand any Barrel as inspected, who
shall not have been duly appointed, and who
shall not have obtained his warrant of ap-
pointment, such person shall for each and
every offence forfeit and pay the sum of
FIVE POUNDS, one moiety of which shall
go to the person who will give information of
the offence.

V. And be it further ordained, That the
Inspectors of Barrels herein before mentioned
to be appointed, shall blow every Barrel by
him inspected and peg up the hole made for
the purpose of blowing the same, and shall be
entitled to demand and receive TWO-PENCE
for each Barrel inspected and branded as
aforesaid, to be paid by the owner or vender
of such Barrel.

VI. And be it further ordained, That no
Inspector of Barrels shall be appointed an
Inspector of Fish.

**A Law to regulate the Inspection
of Fish within the City of Saint
John.**

WHEREAS the credit of the Fish ex-
ported from the City of Saint John is great-
ly injured in Foreign Markets, owing to their
being badly cured and improperly put up—

Be it ordained by the Mayor,
*Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of Saint
John in Common Council convened,* That there
be annually appointed within the said City
one or more Inspectors of Fish, who shall
find good and sufficient security for the due
and faithful discharge of his or their duty in
the sum of Two Hundred Pounds, and who
shall be sworn to the faithful discharge of
such duty.

II. And be it further ordained, That from
and after the passing of this Law, no Cod,
Herrings, Shad, Scale Fish or other Pickled

Fish (Salmon excepted) shall be bought, sold,
or offered to be sold in the City of Saint
John, in any Barrel which shall not have been
branded by one of the Barrel-Inspectors duly
appointed within the said City: And in case
any such Fish (except as before excepted)
shall be bought, sold, or offered to be sold
within the said City in any Barrel which shall
not have been duly inspected and branded as
aforesaid, the person or persons who shall buy,
sell, or offer to sell the same, shall for each
Barrel so bought, sold, or offered for sale,
forfeit and pay the sum of FIVE SHIL-
LINGS, one moiety of which penalty shall
go to the person who will give information of
the offence.

III. And be it further ordained, That no
Inspector of Fish herein mentioned to be ap-
pointed, shall inspect or brand as inspected
any Fish which shall be put up in Barrels
which shall not be made to contain twenty-
eight gallons, and which shall not have been
duly inspected and branded by one of the
Barrel Inspectors as aforesaid, under the pe-
nalty of TEN POUNDS for each and e-
very offence, one half of which penalty shall
go to the person who will give information of
the offence.

IV. And be it further ordained, That no
Pickled Fish as aforesaid (Salmon excepted)
shall be taken, shipped, received on board, or
laden in any ship or vessel in the harbor of
Saint John, within the City of Saint John,
unless such Fish shall have been previously in-
spected and branded by one of the Inspectors
of Fish herein mentioned to be appointed ac-
cording to the true intent and meaning of this
Law, under the penalty of FIVE SHIL-
LINGS for each and every Barrel so taken,
shipped, received on board or laden in, or
caused or suffered to be taken, shipped, re-
ceived on board or laden in any such ship or
vessel, to be paid by the master or owner of
any such ship or vessel at the election of the
party prosecuting, one moiety of the penalty to
be paid to the person who will give informa-
tion of the offence.

V. And be it further ordained, That all and
every person or persons who shall cure and put
up Pickled Fish for sale or exportation (Sal-
mon excepted) shall put the initials of his or
their Christian and Sir names, with a brand-
ing-iron on one of the staves of every such
Barrel which he or they shall cure and put up,
on such part that such letters shall not be hid-
den or concealed by the hoops of such Barrel
(in the head of putting the same on the head
of such Barrel as directed by the fourth section
of the Law entitled "A Law to regulate the
size of Fish Barrels and Inspectors of Fish
within the City of Saint John"—which
section of the said Law is hereby repeated) un-
der the penalty of FIVE SHILLINGS for
each Barrel which he or they shall neglect or
refuse to mark, as herein and hereby directed,
one moiety of the penalty shall be paid to the
person who will give information of the of-
fence.

VI. And be it further ordained, That no
Inspector of Fish herein mentioned to be ap-
pointed, shall inspect or brand as inspected, any
Barrel of pickled Fish as aforesaid (Salmon
excepted) unless the same shall have been
branded as herein and hereby directed with the
initials of the Christians and Sir names of the
person or persons by whom the same shall
have been cured and put up agreeable to the
true intent and meaning of this Law, under
the penalty of FIVE SHILLINGS for each
and every Barrel which any such Inspector
shall so inspect or brand as inspected contrary
to the true intent and meaning of this Law,
one half of which penalty shall go to the per-
son who will give information of the offence.

VII. And be it further ordained, That no
Inspector of Fish herein mentioned to be ap-
pointed, shall inspect or brand as inspected any
Barrel of Fish which shall be presented for
inspection, unless such Barrel of Fish at the
time it is presented to him for inspection shall
be headed up, or such Inspector shall have su-
perintended and seen to the packing and put-
ting up the same under the penalty of FIVE
SHILLINGS for each and every Barrel
which such Inspector shall inspect or brand
contrary to the true intent and meaning of this
Law, one moiety of which penalty shall go
to the person who will give information of
the offence.

VIII. And be it further ordained, That if
any person shall as an Inspector of Fish, in-
spect or brand as inspected any Barrel of
pickled Fish, unless such person shall have
been duly appointed and obtained his warrant
of appointment, such person shall for each
and every Barrel so branded, forfeit and pay
a sum of FIVE POUNDS, one moiety of
which penalty shall go to the person who
will give information of the offence.

SIR,
I HAVE to acquaint you for your in-
formation and guidance, that the Commander
in Chief has directed me to authorize the Cap-
tains and Commanders under my Orders, to
Enter Inhabitants of His Majesty's Provinces
in North America, for Limited Service on
that Coast, upon conditions that they are not
to be sent from thence when it can be pre-
vented; and you will inform them that in the
event of their being unavoidably carried off the
Station, they will be discharged and returned
to their respective homes by the earliest op-
portunity that may offer.

They are to be discharged at the end of the
Service by Pay-Tickets; and it is the Com-
mander in Chief's intention to address the
Commissioner here, on the subject of the
Storekeeper being directed to pay the Persons
the Wages which may appear by their Pay-
Tickets to be due to them.
