Arrived since our last, H. M. B. Fantomes, Capt. Lawrence, from a cruise.

BOSTON, JUNE 19.
On Thursday last, the British frigate, from a frigate near Wood-Island, 7 barges full of men into Winter Harbour, at the mouth of Saco river. The troops landed without opposition, burnt a large new brig and several coasters, and carried off a valuable ship almost new. Both the ship and brig belonged to Thomas Cutts, Esq. The store at the harbour, belonging to Mr. Cutts, which contained a large quantity of rum, was entered by them, but nothing was taken out, and no injury was done to any property except the vessels above mentioned. They remained in the harbour about two and a half hours, but were gone before any force arrived to resist them. The harbour is about 9 miles from the town of Saco.

A 74 and two frigates made their appearance off Portland on Wednesday last, and remained in sight at 12 o'clock on Thursday.
