NOTICE is hereby given, by the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, that all Persons desirous of signifying their Assent to receive £3 10s. per Centum Annuities, in lieu £4 per Centum Annuities, directed to be PAID OFF, in pursuance of a Resolution of the House of Commons, of the 24th February 1824, in the manner therein specified, must signify such Assent on or before the 6th April, 1824, to the Governor and Company of the Banks of England, or of Ireland, according as the Dividends may be payable.

Forms for expressing such Assent have been sent to the several Country Bankers in Great Britain and Ireland; and may also be had of the Postmasters of every Market Town in Great Britain and Ireland, as well as at the Banks of England and Ireland respectively.

N. B. The Assents addressed to the Banks of England and Ireland respectively, will be delivered free of Postage; but care must be taken that they are put into the Post Office in sufficient time to be delivered in London or in Dublin, as the case may be, on or before the 6th April, 1824.

We observe that the Thames Tunnel Companies have begun their operations, by sounding the River, in various lines between King Edward's Stairs and Rotherhithe Church, and by examining the ground to a considerable depth by boring. The result of these trials has hitherto been very encouraging, as the bed of the River proves to be a compact and dense clay.

The following is an extract of a letter dated St. Petersburg, February 15:—"The Emperor has received dispatches from Constanti- nople, which are said to be of a more satisfac- tory nature than those which he has had for some time. Lord Strangford is said to write that the Grand Vizier has positively pledged himself to comply with the demands of Russia, and to grant a general amnesty to the Greeks, which was expected to appear in the course of February."

IMPORTANT.

We have been favoured by a gentleman, who arrived here last week from Gibraltar, with the following Extract of a Letter from a Mercantile House of the first respectability, dated

MALAGA, March 1.

"You will, I dare say, have heard of the late Royal Decrees, respecting the introduc- tion and sale of "Bacalao," (Codfish)—They will prove very injurious to the Trade; inas- much, as cargoes coming in will meet with no competition amongst purchasers:—The follow- ing are extracts from these famous Decrees:

Article 1. Permits the importation of Baca- lao into commercial ports.

Art. 2. All "expeditions" of Bacalao which may arrive during the present year for account, or to the consignment of private Merchants, will be purchased by Government only, at pri- ces that may be agreed upon.

Art. 3. The foregoing Decree will commence to have effect within the term of six months.

Art. 4. On the expiration of the year fixed in art. 2. Government will make its own im- portations by Contract.

"Thus, you see this Branch of Trade will soon be knock'd on the head:—At all events, Shippers will only have one way of continuing it—by making Contracts with the Government through their Agents in this country.

"I do not think it possible that this will con- tinue long—Government is allowed to charge nearly 4 1/2 dollars per quintal on the purchase price, on re-selling from their stores; which will place the article beyond the reach of the common classes—at present the principal con- sumers."

The Algerine war seems to be more deci- dedly against Spain, than any other Power:—Only one English vessel, (a brig,) was reported at Gibrat- tar to have been captured by those Pirates; but their bay is closely blockaded by several of his Ma- jesty's ships; and Convoys for Gibraltar and the Mediterranean have been ordered to sail from Fal- mouth twice in every month, should vessels be ready to take advantage of such protection.

UPPER CANADA.

In a debate which took place lately in the Senate at Washington, relating to the Duty on Wheat, imported into the U. States from Canada, by the Lakes and Canals, it was sta- ted, that vast quantities of that article, paying 15 per cent. exclusive of the respective Tolls, mercantile commissions, &c. were annually received by those conveyances; the benefit of which was, therefore, considerable; but there evidently existed a great jealousy of Ca- nadian rivalry: particularly, with individuals from the Western States:—A Mr. Vance from Ohio, stated that, for several years past, the whole of the Military Posts of the U. States on the N. W. of that river, had been supplied almost exclusively by the people of Upper Canada!

We have Bermuda papers to the 3d inst. The Gazette of March 27 contains a series of charges adduced by the Assembly on the 13th ult. against his Excellency Sir W. Lunley, ac- cusing him of "misrule, and illegal interfe- rence," and concluding with a Resolution, unanimously passed by the House, "patiently "to wait, until our revered Sovereign shall be "pleased to grant relief."—On the 18th ult. his Excellency was pleased to prorogue the Assembly; and on the 24th, it was dissolved by Proclamation.

EXCHANGE COFFEE HOUSE.—We are told that it is the intention of the Committee for the present year, to exert themselves in supporting the character of this excellent Institution; at once so highly reputable to the Town, so ad- vantageous in a commercial point of view; and fully equal, we believe, to any establishment

of the kind on this side of the Atlantic:—As well-wishers to the Community, we hope that every success may attend the laudable endeavours of the Committee; and that the sub- scription may be kept up with all the spirit which the importance of the object requires.

The Adelphi left Liverpool March 23—Pas- senger, Mr. R. PHELAN.

We received Liverpool papers to the day on which the Adelphi left that place; and have been favoured with the London Sun to the 20th ult. From which we have given a variety of extracts in the preceding columns.

The King of Spain is said to have issued a decree prohibiting the importation into the Peninsula of foreign grain, pulse and flour.

We are sorry to state that, on the 15th inst. the store of GEORGE SMITH, Esq. at Picton, was de- stroyed by fire; as also the whole of its contents, among which were the sails and rigging for two large ships, building in that District.

ARMY.

The 95th Regt. Col. Gustavus Brown, just raised, was to embark for the Mediterranean:—The 96th Regt. for this Garrison.

His Majesty's Warrant authorising the Re- cruiting for the 97th, 98th and 99th Regts. was to be issued March 25. The Commissions for the Officers were to be dated on that day.

The Athol will probably sail from Bermuda for this port about the close of the present month; and from hence proceed with specie for Quebec; where the Earl and Countess of DALHOUSIE will embark on board her for Leith.

Should the Menai have arrived at Bermuda, the Athol will bring orders for the Niemen to proceed for England, with his Excellency Sir JAMES KEMPT and suite.

Sailed, Feb. 26, the Arrow Packet from Dover for Calais, with Lord Granyille and suite, Amb. to the Hague.

The Salisbury packet, from hence, arrived at Falmouth March 13, 19 days passage. The ship Mary Ann, John Young, master, was to sail from London for this port March 1st.
