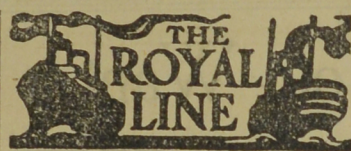

## JUDGMENT IN HEBERT CASE NEXT MONDAY

Was to have been Handed Down this Week by Judge Charbonneau but Unexpected Delays Occurred

Montreal, Feb. 16—Judgment in the famous and much delayed wedding annulment case of Eugene Hebert and Marie Anne Cloutier under the provisions of the *Ne Temere* Act will be delivered on Monday morning at 10.30 o'clock. This announcement was made this morning by Judge Charbonneau, who has the case under consideration with every degree of definiteness. The judgment was originally slated for Wednesday of this week, but owing to unexpected delays, Judge Charbonneau found it impossible to render his decision then. Saturday was the next day fixed and there seemed to be no obstacle in the way of the anxiously awaited decision on that day. This morning Mr. George V. Cousins, notary for Mrs. Hebert, had a conference with Judge Charbonneau, notifying him that it was necessary for him to be out of the city Saturday, and the judgment was accordingly fixed for Monday.

## FLOODS IN SPAIN ARE SUBSIDING

Seville, Spain, Feb. 16—The floods which have devastated this city for many days are now rapidly subsiding. ## TORIES WERE BEATEN WITH THEIR OWN STICK

E. W. Thomson in the Boston Transcript says:—Premier Borden and his Cabinet this week suffered a stick which their ultra-Protestant friends cut for beating Sir Wilfrid Laurier in Ontario. They alleged during the recent general election that Laurier had wickedly aided the Pope by not employing the Federal authority of Canada to defy an alleged application of the "Ne Temere" decree. They declared that this decree had the effect of annulling marriages contracted in Quebec between Protestants and Catholics, and also the effect of bringing such marriages under suspicion throughout the Dominion. This was grand campaigning stuff in many constituencies of Ontario and other British Provinces. Conservative M. Ps have admitted or boasted in Parliament that that stick went far to beat the Liberal Party. This week Mr. Lancaster, a Tory Protestant of Ontario, brought in a Bill designed to make clear, by Federal legislation, that any marriage contracted between any two persons legally free (according to Protestant views) to marry another should be valid if the ceremony were performed and witnessed by any person anywhere, authorized to solemnize marriage. This Bill, if passed would remove certain doubts as to whether a Protestant minister in Quebec can validly solemnize marriage between two Catholics, or between a Catholic and a Protestant.

If Premier Borden had been bound by the "Ne Temere" anti-Laurier agitation, which was so profitable to him, he would have accepted the Lancaster Bill. But he felt either free to reject it, or obliged to do so by consideration for his "Nationalists" and other Catholics supporters. He caused Lancaster to be voted down. But he engaged, at the same time, to present a "stated case" to Canada's Supreme Court and to the Imperial Privy Council, in order to elicit from these authorities an academic opinion as to whether the Ottawa Federal Parliament has power to enact the Lancaster proposal or its equivalent. This may be a reasonable course. It has the merit in some Tory eyes of staying off decision till after the next general elections. But so many Tories followed Lancaster that the ministry beat his Bill by only twenty-five votes. A dangerous family quarrel was revealed. As between Tory M. Ps it may be easily composed. But what about their electors? Few of them can be so stupid as not to perceive how they were bamboozled by the "Ne Temere" cry against Laurier.
