KENT LIBERALS ARE GETTING INTO LINE

Richibucto, Feb. 20.—Mr. A. B. Copp, M. P. P., leader of the Provincial Liberal Opposition, Hon. C. H. Labilliois, M. P. P., of Restigouche and Mr. P. J. Veniot, North Shore organizer for the Liberal party were in town on Thursday visiting the prominent members of the Liberal party here. In the Temperance Hall here last night a meeting of Liberals was held with Ex-Sheriff Leger in the chair and Mr. F. S. Peters, as secretary. The attendance was representative, not only of this vicinity, but of all parts of the county.

After hearing speeches from Messrs. Copp, Labilliois and Veniot, it was decided to hold a convention to choose candidates to contest the next local election.

The convention will be held at Rexton in the public hall, on Tuesday, March 19th, at 2.30 o'clock. In the evening a public meeting will be addressed by the candidates chosen and prominent members of the Liberal party.

The speakers showed that there had been gross mismanagement of the public money on roads and bridges. Instances were given where bridges after construction had been begun, had to be partially torn down and reconstructed, owing to the incompetency of the supervisors in charge. Complaints were received from nearly all sections of the County, known as colonization districts, as to the different manner in which their requests have been treated.

The friends of the Liberal Opposition are in good fighting trim in Kent County, being encouraged by the return to the ranks of many voters who have been supporting the Liberal party during the last few years in this county, but who are now convinced that it is "time for a change in local affairs." The reports by those present of expenditure of public money in the different districts of the county by the present government showed gross mismanagement. In some cases even the letters are unanswered.

PENITENTIAL CURTAIN FALLS

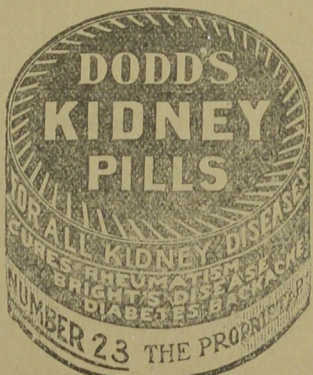
