

VIRGINIA HAS NO DECIDED CHOICE

Richmond, Va., March 26.—That the Old Dominion has no decided preference as yet in the matter of a candidate for the Democratic presidential nomination is indicated by the assembled here today to decide upon views expressed by the members of the Democratic committee who as the time and place for holding the State convention to select the delegates to the Baltimore convention. Woodrow Wilson has made the most active campaign here so far and his name probably is heard more frequently than that of any of the other Democratic aspirants. The fact that he is a native of Virginia is expected to aid his candidacy to some extent. Congressman Underwood is well thought of and he also is regarded as something of a "native son," since he was educated at the University of Virginia. Champ Clark has many admirers and Governor Harmon also would be an acceptable candidate, especially among the old-line Democrats. Unless developments between now and the meeting of the State convention change the situation materially it appears likely that Virginia's twenty-four delegates will go to Baltimore without instructions.

EXAMINATION IN HAYES CASE BEGAN THIS MORNING

threats and that neither James D. Blair nor his wife were in the post office at the time Hayes was there.

FRANK HUGHES.

Frank Hughes of St. Mary's, first went on the stand. He swore that on the night of Saturday, 16th inst., he saw the defendant enter the shop and post office of James D. Blair. Others in the shop were Charles McCoy, Charles Blair, Truman Burt, witness, Miss Margaret Mable and Chipman Carroll. Defendant was under the influence of liquor and asked Charles Blair, "Where is Jim?" Witness supposed James D. Blair was meant. Charles Blair replied he was sick in bed. Hayes then asked for mail and was told that his niece had got the mail about four o'clock. At that time it was shortly after eight. Hayes staggered over toward witness who then noticed an open jack-knife in his hand. Witness said to Hayes, "Look out, Foolishness, or you will cut someone with that knife." Hayes staggered backward and forward against witness and dropped the knife on the floor. Witness tried to pick the knife up and Hayes tried to tramp on his fingers. Witness pushed Hayes back and told Charles McCoy to pick up the knife. Hayes made a dive for the knife and witness picked it up and put it in his pocket. Hayes then shoved witness against the wall, knocking over a couple of cans. Witness then pushed Hayes away from him and left the shop. Hayes followed him and witness tried to induce Hayes to get in his sleigh and drive home with witness. Hayes said he would not drive with witness and drove off alone. He stopped a short distance away and returned to Blair's shop, entering a short distance and asked witness for the knife. Witness went to James P. Hayes' shop, keeping the knife and followed by Hayes with horse and sleigh. Hayes entered the shop and again asked for his knife. When Hayes left witness he was fairly good-natured.

Witness knew that James D. Blair's bed was upstairs. Hayes did not attempt to enter the bed-room.

CROSS EXAMINED.

Cross examined by Mr. J. D. Phinney, witness said that the St. Mary's post office was in the building occupied by James D. Blair as a residence. The sleeping apartments were upstairs. To get upstairs from the store it is necessary to pass through the dining-room and hall to the stairway. At the time Hayes was there the door between the store and dining-room was closed. Thomas Carroll having closed it when he went through to see James D. Blair. Mr. Carroll was upstairs while Hayes was in the shop. Neither James D. Blair nor Mrs. James D. Blair were in the shop at that time. Charles Blair was behind the counter and appeared to be acting as assistant in the post office. Hayes addressed no offensive remark to Charles Blair and the latter said nothing to Hayes. Latter made considerable noise. The knife was an ordinary jack-knife. When Hayes entered store some of those present left. When witness and Hayes left store only Charles Blair and the boy Chipman Carroll were present. The second time that witness entered Blair's store Mrs. James D. Blair was present, telephoning to James Hayes' store. Witness neither saw nor heard Hayes say anything to James D. Blair or Mrs. James D. Blair.




