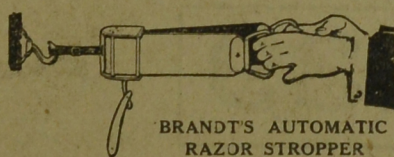

N.W.S. FORECAST FOR THE COMING WEEK

Washington, D. C., Feb. 24—A number of Republican conventions are scheduled for the week to select delegates to the National Convention at Chicago. The North Carolina State Convention will meet in Raleigh on Wednesday and the South Carolina Convention in Columbia the day following. District conventions to be held during the week include those of the First, Second, Third and Seventh districts of Alabama, the First and Tenth districts of Virginia, the Second, Seventh and Eleventh districts of Georgia, and the Third district of Missouri.

President Taft has no public engagements announced for the week, excepting those of purely social character. Colonel Roosevelt will go to Boston to attend a meeting of the Harvard Board of Overseers and during the several days that he will spend there it is expected he will confer with many influential New England Republicans. Governor Harmon has engagements to speak during the week before the legislatures of Virginia and Maryland.

Pursuant to the call of Governor Osborn the Michigan legislature will assemble in special session Monday to pass a bill providing for a presidential primary.

One of the largest conventions of the week will be the annual meeting of the Department of Superintendence of the National Educational Society, which is expected to attract a thousand or more prominent educators to St. Louis.

The trial of Bert H. Franklin, the McNamara jury, is scheduled to begin in Los Angeles Tuesday. This is the case in which an indictment charging a similar offence has been returned against Clarence Darrow, the attorney for the McNamaras.

A joint wage conference to discuss a new contract for the anthracite field will begin in New York, Tuesday. The miners demand an eight-hour day, recognition of the United Mine Workers, a minimum wage rate of \$3.50 a day for miners on consideration work and \$2.50 a day for laborers, and a more convenient and uniform system of adjusting local grievances. The operators, it is stated, are inclined to resist the demands of the miners as unreasonable and exorbitant. The present agreement will expire at the end of March and unless an agreement is reached before that time a general strike is threatened.

Important events of the week abroad will include the great anti-suffrage demonstration to be held in London, with Lord Cromer presiding, and developments in the industrial situation in England. Unless the demands of the British Miners' Federation are granted a national strike of coal miners is threatened for February 29.

Of interest to followers of sport and athletics in America will be the begining of the big league baseball players for the spring training camps in the South, the opening of the annual tournament of the American Bowling Congress in Chicago, and the opening of the annual Sportsmen's Show in Madison Square Garden, New York.

FRENCH AVIATOR BROKE A RECORD

Pau, France, Feb. 23—Maurice Labuteau, the French aviator, today broke the world's aerodrome record for a two hours' flight by covering a distance of 227 kilometres, 454 metres, (141 miles, 640 yards), at the flying ground here. Labuteau already held the record for a two hours' flight, which he established on January 24, at Pau, when he flew 205 kilometres, 647 metres, (127 miles, 5 furlongs), in that time.

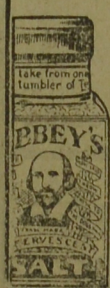

TO PROMOTE INDUSTRIAL EDUCATION

Buffalo, Feb. 23—A hundred or more men and women interested in the vocational work in the public schools assembled in Buffalo today for the third annual convention of the New York State branch of the National Society for the promotion of Industrial Education. The opening session was held at the Hotel Statler this afternoon with George M. Forbes of Rochester presiding. Among those in attendance were many persons of prominence in civic and educational affairs. The sessions of the convention will conclude tomorrow.

SIMMONS FACES BITTER FIGHT

Baleigh, N. C., Feb. 23—With the senatorial primary fight in North Carolina but a few months distant, outward and visible signs are abundant that the contest for the seat of Senator Simmons is to be hard fought and exceedingly bitter. Senator Simmons' term of office will expire one year hence and he is a candidate for re-election. His principal rival for the toga appears to be Governor W. W. Kitchin, who has already taken to the stump and delivered some vigorous attacks on Simmons' political record, particularly his vote in the Lorimer case. A third candidate for the senatorship is former Governor Charles B. Aycock and a fourth is chief Justice Walter Clark, of the State supreme court. It is believed that a second primary confined to the two leaders in the first primary will be necessary to settle the contest.
