## THE COLONIES AS TRADE FACTORS

(Manitoba Free Press.)

Col. the Hon. Sam Hughes has not vouchsafed any more light upon that extraordinary utterance of his at Vancouver that "it is well known that Germany made a tentative offer to stop the shipbuilding race in return for the concession of British Colonies." It is a remark more enlightening in regard to the mental processes of our minister of war than in regard to world affairs.

As the writer of "The Great Illusion" well says: "In the modern world political dominion is playing a more and more effaced role as a factor in commerce; the non-political factors have in practice made it all imperative." It is the case with every modern nation that the outside territories from which it derives the greatest business profit are precisely those of which it does not "own" a foot. The greatest part of Great Britain's overseas trade is done with countries which she makes no attempt to "own" control, control or dominate—and, incidentally, Great Britain long ceased to do any of these things with British Colonies.

Germany's Colonies are failures. Germans have to be offered inducements to go there, and Germany's trade with them is inconsiderable. But Germany does an immense trade with the countries of South America. As Angell points out, Germany draws today many millions more in tributes from those countries than Spain, which poured out mountains of treasure and rivers of blood in their conquest. They are Germany's real Colonies, and this does not to war, but to commerce. Millions of Germans living in Prussia and Westphalia derive profit or make their living out of countries to which German dominion does not in any way extend. A like fact is true of Great Britain.

France has colonies, but they cost her more to occupy and administer than their trade is worth. France has been acquiring a great deal of territory in Africa and elsewhere since the Franco-German war, whereas Germany is represented as being more and more cramped and throttled for lack of Colonies. But Germany has added 20,000,000 to her population, while the French population in France has actually diminished. Germany has gone on prospering, with

out any extension at all, practically, of German dominion.

Speaking of this militarist idea of the need of "expansion," Angell writes:

"It is a perfectly futile matter, one which the immense majority of the German, English, French, Italian and Turkish people could afford to treat with the completest indifference. For, to the vast majority of these 250,000,000 people more or less, it does not matter two straws whether Morocco or some vague African swamp near the Equator is administered by German, French, Italian, or Turkish officials, so long as it is well administered. Or rather one should go further: if French, German, or Italian colonization of the past is any guide, the nation which wins in the conquest for territory of this sort has added a wealth-draining incubus."


But still international bitterness and suspicion are promoted, and millions upon millions are devoted to the creation of armaments. Facts, of course, must be faced as facts; and this is not yet a world governed by pure reason. Angell may be decided as a visionary; but it is not Col. the Hon. Sam Hughes, with his mania of militarism, a visionary who is the farther astray of the two?

#### WHAT NEWSPAPERS COST

(Leslie's Weekly)  
It is the cost of the news service and not the cost of the plant that makes starting a newspaper difficult. Three-fifths of the cost of operating a modern daily are what might be called overhead charges. I mean by that, news service, editorial writers, pictures, cablegrams and the various bureaus. The mechanical side represents only two fifths of the remainder. I do not know a single progressive newspaper that is not constantly increasing its news outlay far faster than it piles up its mechanical expenditures. The wise editor knows that it is the news that sells the paper and not the press that prints it. In my wide range of newspaper acquaintance, I do not know any successful newspapers that are not owned by themselves. It is not possible for a newspaper to be successful, run in the private interest. The newspaper is a public concern, and when it ceases to serve the public it ceases to be a successful newspaper.
