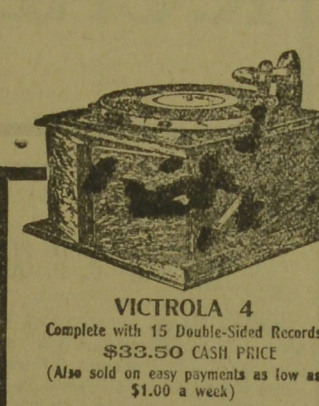
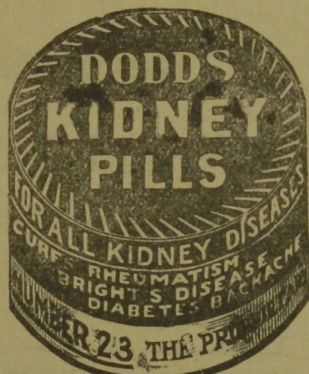

VETERAN JOURNALISTS  
TELLS OF NEW ENGLAND

(From Frank B. Sanborn's Letter in  
 the Springfield Republican.)

Since my last letter I have been in  
 four New England States—Maine, New  
 Hampshire, Massachusetts and Ver-  
 mont—three of which, from present  
 prospects, are likely to give Governor  
 Wilson their electoral vote. Whether  
 Roosevelt is gaining or losing in  
 these States as a whole it is hard to  
 say. He is gaining in Vermont, for  
 the tariff and the reciprocity fiasco  
 slightly aid him, and the noise he  
 has been making in Boston and  
 Providence, faithfully reproduced in  
 newspaper megaphones, but fright-  
 ened some Republicans, fascinated  
 others, and even allured some of  
 those Democrats who voted for him  
 in the primaries. But in New Hamp-  
 shire he seems to be losing, from the  
 indecision of those men who support-  
 ed him in the spring and yet cannot  
 bear to leave their old Republican  
 party, which has existed under vari-  
 ous names almost seventy years,  
 which holds most of the State and  
 county offices, and has usually paid  
 higher for single votes than the Dem-  
 ocrats could afford to pay. If T. R.  
 insists on a new third party in New  
 Hampshire he will lose about half of  
 the men who were for him under Gov-  
 ernor Bass in the spring. Some of  
 these, not wishing the State to go  
 for Taft, will vote for Wilson; while  
 many of the Taft men will also vote  
 for Wilson, in order to give Roose-  
 velt the more crushing defeat. Dem-  
 ocrats will vote for Taft and the Leg-  
 islature bids fair to be Republican,  
 thus insuring a party man for Sena-  
 tor in place of Burnham. But proper  
 discretion used by the Democrats  
 in nominating the successor of Gov-  
 ernor Bass may well be a Democrat.  
 of Vermont you have already given  
 the most probable guess.

Massachusetts grows more puzzling  
 as time goes on. Roosevelt appears  
 to be gaining, or perhaps is so, but  
 the tide may turn and run out as  
 fast as it run in. The sincere sim-  
 pletons are with him, on general prin-  
 ciples. He answers to the descrip-  
 tion given by a fond father of his  
 young child who was to be a politi-  
 cian, said the father, "because he  
 uses more words that sound well and  
 mean absolutely nothing than any liv-  
 ing man." This cannot be disputed;  
 it is Roosevelt's trump card, and  
 even Dr. Abbott cannot surpass him  
 in sophistry.

As for Maine, where I was yester-  
 day, there is far less obvious excite-  
 ment than in Massachusetts or Ver-  
 mont. The Democrats are active and  
 confident, holding meetings and mak-  
 ing strong speeches on State issues;  
 but the Republicans are so worried  
 over the attempt of Roosevelt to  
 have a third party State ticket that  
 they seem to be losing precious time  
 in their campaign. They have had an  
 "Arnold memorial" at Augusta (the  
 Benedict Arnold who invaded Canada  
 through Maine in 1776), and reunions  
 of Civil War regiments, and  
 family reunions, like that of the  
 Weares on York, in various Maine  
 towns. But their State campaign on  
 the Republican side "lingers shiver-  
 ing on the brink," because the nation-  
 al speakers cannot be allowed there  
 for fear of exciting the Roosevelt  
 party and destroying all hope of  
 carrying the State election. The  
 chances now favor the Democrats in  
 that, while it is generally thought  
 that Wilson will win in November.

## MEET TO DISCUSS WATERWAYS

New London, Conn. Sept. 5.—One of  
 the most notable gatherings ever as-  
 sembled in the history of this coun-  
 try in the interest of waterway de-  
 velopment was called to order at the  
 Hotel Griswold in this city today,  
 when the Atlantic Deeper Waterways  
 Association met for its fifth annual  
 convention. The visitors who repre-  
 sented all of the eastern States from  
 Maine to Florida were welcomed to  
 Connecticut by Governor Baldwin.

President J. Hampton Moore of  
 Pennsylvania in his annual address  
 reviewed the work already accom-  
 plished in the project for an intra-  
 coastal canal from Boston, Mass., to  
 Beaufort, N.C., and spoke most en-  
 couragingly of the prospects for the  
 fulfillment of the great development  
 plan towards which the association is  
 bending its energies. The Cape Cod  
 canal which is a prominent feature of  
 the project, is rapidly nearing com-  
 pletion. The Southern end of the pro-  
 posed waterway, from Norfolk to  
 Albemarle Sound is provided for in  
 the last rivers and harbors act. At  
 the next session of Congress the as-  
 sociation will endeavor to have an  
 appropriation made for the improve-  
 ment of the old Delaware and Ches-  
 apeake canal which is to form another  
 important link in the system.

No session of the convention was  
 held this afternoon, the time being  
 devoted by the delegates to a trip to  
 Fisher's Island and an inspection of  
 the great fortifications at Fort  
 Wright. President Taft is expected to  
 deliver an address at the concluding  
 session of the convention.
