BETTER FARMING SPECIAL  
ON THE INTERCOLONIAL

A large staff of competent instructors will accompany the Better Farming Special Train which will run over the C. P. R. and I. C. R. systems in this province from June 8th to 20th.

## COMPETENT STAFF

Professor Barton, Professor of Animal Husbandry at Macdonald College will have charge of the Cattle Demonstrations and Lectures, and Professor Jull, Macdonald College, and Seth Jones, Provincial Poultry Superintendent, Sussex, N. B., will demonstrate and discuss all lines of poultry work.

An exhibit demonstrating the importance of Drainage and Cultivation of Soils will be in charge of Professor Lynds of Macdonald College.

The essentials to success in Crop Growing will be explained by exhibits of seeds, fertilizers, samples of cereals and other plants. Professor Fuller, Macdonald College, will be in charge of this branch, and Professor Blair will give special attention to the problems of potato growing.

The Dairy Branch will be fitted with all appliances for Cow Testing and Milk Testing. This branch will be in charge of H. N. Flewelling, Sussex, N. B., in charge of Cow Testing in New Brunswick; and the manufacturing part of this subject will be discussed by C. W. McDougall, Dairy Superintendent, Sussex, N. B., who will have an outfit for home butter-making, etc.

Fruit Growing in its different branches will be demonstrated by exhibits of nursery trees, orchard appliances, including spray pumps, spraying mixtures, fruit packages, etc., and will be in charge of Professor Blair and S. L. Peters, Dominion Fruit Inspector for New Brunswick. Officials of the Provincial Fruit Branch will also be in attendance at various times.

Injurious Insects, their prevention and destruction, will be the subject of an extensive exhibit of mounted insects and the means used to fight them. Professor Lochhead, Macdonald College, and Wm. McIntosh, St. John, N. B., Acting Provincial Entomologist, will have charge of this branch. Mr. McIntosh will give special attention to explanations regarding the Brown Tail Moth.

## INTERESTING EXHIBITS

The train will also have with it a number of interesting exhibits in connection with dairy and beef cattle, poultry and poultry appliances, soils and drainage, farm crops, weeds, dairying appliances, home-made butter, injurious insects, fruit-growing, etc.

STOCK MARKET REVIEW

St. John, May 25—An intelligent summing up of stock market conditions at the present time is a difficult task. Fluctuations are largely in the hands of the professionals and what movement there is in prices is confined largely to specialties.

The politics continue to be the dominating and over-shadowing influence and the remarkable hold which Mr. Roosevelt appears to have obtained on public sentiment has forced into the situation a complication difficult to determine. The inevitable split in the Republican party, due to his successes, together with the extremely elusive and erratic character of this particular nominee has added materially to the uncertainty of capital and business interests generally at a time when a rest cure was never more badly required for the sake of the commercial welfare of American business. The uncertainty of politics is always a market factor not conducive to expansion or business prosperity and this element will dominate for many months to come, conservatism in commitments of orders.

A trading position is still the safe one to assume. Rallies from declines on technical and speculative conditions will be frequently seen and on sharp breaks stocks may be bought for moderate profits. Among the specialties, we would suggest Brooklyn Rapid Transit and International Paper Common and Preferred. We rather look for a decided betterment in values for both of these stocks.

## MONEY

The money situation shows but little change, the supply is still plentiful in United States and rates continue easy though there is a tendency on the part of the banks to keep their affairs in as liquid condition as possible. The reduction of the rate by the Bank of England ten days ago has been followed by a similar reduction by the Bank of France, the official rate in both countries being quoted at 3 per cent.; in Germany the tendency is towards hardness and money is not so easy as else-

## LIVED UNDER 6 SOVEREIGNS

Montreal, May 25—A link with the past has been broken by the death yesterday at the age of 92 of Mrs. Elizabeth Wilson Miles, widow of the late Dr. Henry H. Miles the well known Canadian historian who was formerly vice-principal of the Bishops college and later superintendent of Protestant Education in the Province.

Mrs. Miles was born at Ripon, Yorks, Eng. in 1819, the year of Queen Victoria's birth and has lived under six sovereigns, namely George III., George IV., and William IV., Victoria, Edward VII. and George V.
