## MR. LOW'S ANSWER TO RENFREW TORIES

The following letter was sent yesterday by Mr. Thomas A. Low, of Renfrew, to the secretary of the Liberal-Conservative Association at Arnprior, Ont., relating to the election in South Renfrew and an opponent for the Hon. Geo. P. Graham.

"I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 21st inst., enclosing copies of two resolutions adopted at your convention held in the town of Renfrew on Friday last.

"Let me first deal with the resolution approving and endorsing the action of the twenty-seven Conservatives, who originally entered into the agreement whereby the nominee of the Liberal party was to be allowed to be returned to the House of Commons by acclamation, in return for the Liberal party allowing Mr. T. W. McGarry to be returned to the Legislature unopposed. It may be argued by some that the parties to the agreement only signed as individuals, but once your association in convention, approved of it, it was no longer an individual arrangement and I cannot understand how the same body of men, including Dr. Maloney in mass meeting assembly could consistently place a candidate in the field to oppose the Hon. Geo. P. Graham, who was unanimously chosen as the Liberal candidate at a convention of the Liberal Association held on the 14th day of November last.

"Referring to that portion of your resolution, in which you suggest, 'if there was any misunderstanding in connection with my resignation,' I can only say that the wording of the two agreements exchanged by the Liberal and Conservative parties are so plain that there is not the slightest room for any misunderstanding by any person who signed the agreements, or on the part of the convention which approved of it.

"Your association by the resolution adopted at your convention has, if the resolution was intended to mean anything at all, approved of the agreement, and in other words, have agreed to allow the Hon. Mr. Graham to be returned unopposed. In the face of your action upon that occasion it is impossible for you to oppose the Hon. Geo. P. Graham with out placing the Conservative party of South Renfrew in a most ridiculous light before the people of the Dominion of Canada.

"In conclusion I desire to say that the Hon. Geo. P. Graham is the chosen candidate of the Liberal party and has been for some months and it is therefore impossible for me to accept your offer of re-election by acclamation, and I further believe that should Mr. Graham be opposed in this election, the rank and file of the Conservative party in South Renfrew will show by their vote that they believe in an honest agreement being carried out, and that they present any breach of faith.
