NEED NOT REMAIN IN COLD HOUSES

Montreal, Jan. 30—There is no longer need for tenants to remain in uncomfortably cold houses, no matter what the length of lease. Judge Charbonneau declared in practice court yesterday, that cold weather was sufficient excuse for breaking a lease. Michael McBrearty lived above a vacant and unheated store. His water and gas pipes became frozen with the result that the supply of both commodities was on several occasions cut off. The court ordered the cancellation of the lease, freeing the plaintiff from all obligations thereunder.

MANY PETITION AGAINST NE TEMERE DECREE

Toronto, Jan. 30—Petitions pouring into the office of the Evangelical Alliance against the "Ne Temere" decree. Hundreds of signatures added daily and they come from all parts of the province. Requests are also coming in to the secretary Rev. E.D. Silcox for more blank forms, letters being received from as far away as Nova Scotia. Further action will be determined by the executive of the Alliance, which will meet on Friday afternoon.

SIR MAX AITKEN TO FRAME A TARIFF

London, Jan. 30—The Daily News states that during their stay in the south of France, Bonar Law and Sir Max Aitken will frame a scale of the suggested tariff for the United Kingdom. Sir Max Aitken has been specially asked to assist because of his considerable experience of tariffs in his native Canada, and because he is generally believed to have the best financial judgment of any of the present generation of Unionists.

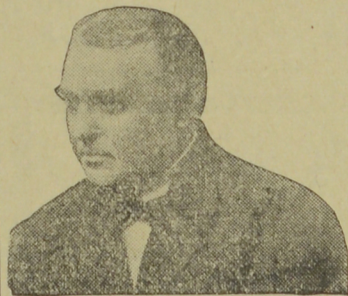
DUKE OF CONNAUGHT TO CANCEL VISIT

FORMER GOVERNOR OF N. B. IS DEAD

London, Jan. 30—Baron Stanmore died here today in his 84th year. He was one of the most prominent British colonial officials, having held the position of Lieutenant-governor or Governor of a large number of British Colonies, including New Brunswick, Trinidad, Mauritius, Jiji, New Zealand and Ceylon. He was a prolific leader, and member of the House of Lords, although he took very little part in politics.
