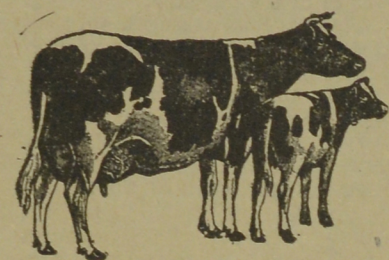

ORDERS MASS FOR  
PEACE IN MEXICO

Mexico City, Dec. 9—In obedience to a Papal decree there began last night at midnight in every Catholic Church throughout the Republic a special mass for Divine intervention in Mexico. In St. Peter's at Rome, at the same hour, or six o'clock Rome time this morning, the Pope himself will join the prayers for the restoration of peace.

That the revolution in Mexico has resulted in conditions so bad that nothing more than human agencies is necessary to right them appears to be indicated, not only by the reports of the rebel operations, but by the action of the Secretary of the Interior Rafael Hernandez.

The Secretary recently summoned Mgr. Boglioni and appealed to him to use the power of the Church to assist in restoring order. The Secretary requested that the Pope issue a decree to that end.

The general situation is best defined by explaining that the government is in control of all the big towns in the Republic and many of the smaller towns, but practically all the disturbed regions throughout the country are in the power of the insurgents.

## A WASHINGTON

Washington, Dec. 10—With the formal presentation of Great Britain's protest against the Panama Canal Bill, Secretary of State Knox, today got down to a careful study of the objection raised by Sir Edward Grey in the lengthy note submitted last night by Ambassador Bryce.

British minister for foreign affairs basing his principal objection on the proposal to relieve all American shipping from Panama Canal tolls either by exempting it from charges or remitting the tolls paid, contends that section of the law is in violation of the Hay-Pauncefote treaty and proposes that if the question can be settled in no other way, that it should be submitted to arbitration at the Hague.

SPANISH TO BUILD  
THEIR DREADNAUGHTS

Paris, Dec. 10—The Spanish naval program has just been decided upon according to a special despatch from Madrid. It will comprise three dreadnoughts of 21,000 tons each, two of the latest type of destroyers, nine torpedo boats and three submarines.

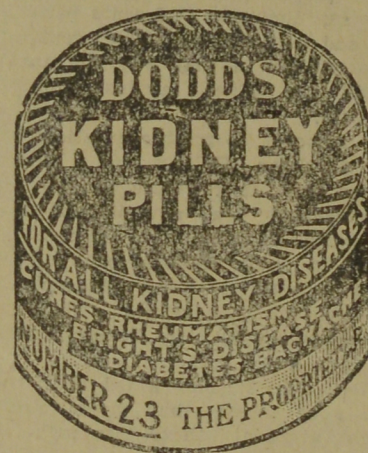
All the vessels are to be constructed in Spanish shipbuilding yards. The work is to be begun as soon as the battleship Alfonso XIII has been launched at Ferrol.

The new dreadnought Espala which was launched early this year will be delivered in April next.

DR. CARTER SPEAKS  
AT MONTREAL

Montreal, Dec. 9—That the injustice done to the people of the Maritime Provinces by making since confederation, Quebec's representation in the Dominion House the standard by which the number of representatives of other provinces should be determined, ought to be remedied by making an irreducible minimum of representatives for each province, was the suggestion made by Dr. W. S. Carter, chief superintendent of education for New Brunswick, in an address on the Maritime Provinces before the Canadian Club this afternoon.
