## CRITICS OF BORDEN'S NAVAL POLICY

(Toronto Globe)

The London Daily News, the journal which shares with The Daily Chronicle the distinction of supporting the Asquith Government against the attacks of eight metropolitan morning Unionist papers is "already beginning to look Mr. Borden's gift horse in the mouth. The News, considering the question as to whether the three Canadian battleships are to be in addition to the existing British naval program, says: 'If they are, it means that the taxpayers of this country will have to man and maintain three superfluous battleships. The intention may be beyond praise but the effect is the very opposite of that intended.'

An irreverent critic of the "gift" says it reminds him of the story of the man who met with a financial reverse and whose friends made up their minds to show that they were behind him with their sympathy and support, so they subscribed money for the most powerful and most handsome motor-car that could be bought: a car that consumed enormous quantities of gasoline and needed more expert care. They told him they wanted him to use the new car constantly as an evidence to the world of his prosperity. It was a gift freely tendered, but as they might want it back some time they hoped and believed he would keep the car in good repair. The recipient of their favor thanked them cordially, for he was a gentleman accustomed to the usages of polite society, but when he had put the fine new car in the garage beside adequate and handy runabout, had inserted an advertisement for a chauffeur, and had retired to his study to think things over, he concluded that it was very dangerous to have too many impulsive friends. "For," said he, "while I may survive this gift, another such would inevitably involve me in bankruptcy." 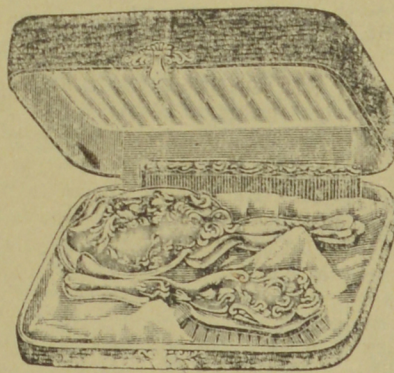
