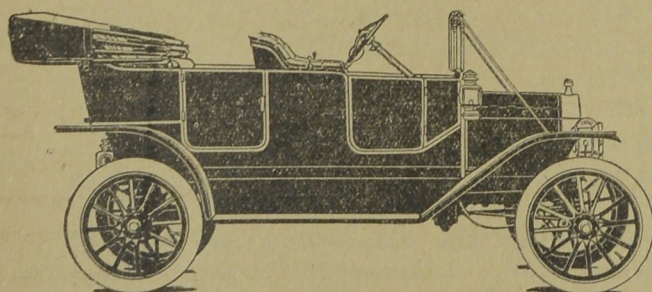

# Lieutenant Governor's Ball Was a Brilliant Affair

**Legislative Building the Scene of a Brilliant Social Function Last Evening--  
Nearly Five Hundred Guests Present**

One of the most brilliant social events Fredericton has witnessed in many years was the grand ball given by His Honor Lieutenant-Governor Wood in the Legislative building last evening. In the matter of attendance it was a record breaker; there being fully five hundred ladies and gentlemen present to partake of the hospitality of the new Lieutenant Governor. The Legislative building has been the scene of many gay social functions in days gone by but never before has such a galaxy of youth and beauty assembled within its walls.

Practically every County in the province was represented in the gay throng which tripped the light fantastic in the Assembly Chamber and promenaded in the spacious corridors.

### THE RECEPTION

The Lieutenant-Governor received his guests in the Assembly Chamber, being assisted in the pleasant task by his daughter, Mrs F. B. Black, his son and daughter-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. H. M. Wood and Major F. B. Black, A.D.C. The guests were presented by Mr. R. S. Barker private secretary.

The Assembly Chamber was very prettily decorated for the occasion with flags, bunting and potted plants which with the gorgeous feminine costumes and the sombre evening dress of the gentlemen combined to make a very beautiful and inspiring scene.

O'Brien's orchestra from a position near the Speaker's dais discoursed excellent music during the progress of the reception and afterwards played a dance program of eighteen numbers. The members' desks and chairs had been removed from the chamber and a linen covering for the carpet completed the transformation into a ball room. The program of dances included waltzes, two steps, millets and lancers. It lacked a few minutes of three o'clock when the orchestra played the National Anthem and the guests took their departure.

### A FINE LUNCHEON

Luncheon was served in the library at midnight under the direction of Mr. J. J. McCaffrey, proprietor of the Queen Hotel. Mr. McCaffrey was caterer to the present King and Queen during their visit to St. John several years ago and in this line of work has few equals and no superiors in Eastern Canada. He had a capable staff of assistants, the choicest viands were served and everything passed off in a most satisfactory manner.

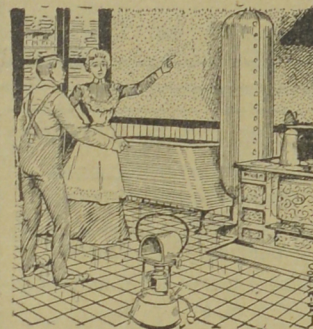
