### HONOR MEMORY OF FAMOUS RABBI

Dr. Adler was the author of many writings on Jewish historical subjects and was considered one of the best informed theologians in America.

## FINANCIAL and COMMERCIAL

### BANK OF COMMERCE

Toronto, Jan. 10—Although it was plain that the Canadian Bank of Commerce, having exhausted its authorized capital by the absorption of the Eastern Townships Bank, would necessarily soon seek new powers in this direction, the statement of Sir Edmund Walker, uttered in the most matter-of-fact tone at the annual meeting yesterday that the directors decided to recommend an increase in the authorized capital to \$25,000,000 produced an audible gasp from the assembled shareholders. The secret obviously had been well kept. As a matter of fact it is just possible that the decision to make the recommendation was not formally ratified until the meeting of directors which immediately preceded the general gathering.

A full report of the meeting of the addresses by Sir Edmund Walker, Mr. Alexander Laird and others appears upon another page Mr Laird takes rank as a director in addition to his office of general manager. He succeeds to the place held over a score of years by Mr. Robert Kilgour. The names of the four representatives of the Eastern Townships Bank on the Commerce board were of course not mentioned but provision was made to increase the directorate to nineteen one extra being added to come and go on. The meeting also took the first step towards changing the par value of the share from \$50 to \$100 and of course enthusiastically supported all the resolution placed before it.

One of the interesting statements made by Sir Edmund Walker in connection with the amount of \$500,000 taken into the general account "from

over-appropriation in connection with assets now realized" was that the bank had never taken into its ordinary accounts until the past year any of the profits arising from its Dawson business.

Managers from many widely-separated points in the bank's territory were present for the meeting and were the guests at a dinner in their honor at the York Club in the evening.

### KHARTOUM CATHEDRAL CONSECRATED

London, Jan. 13—A large party of English churchmen and their families will depart tomorrow for Khartoum to attend the consecration of the great cathedral that has been erected in the metropolis of the upper Nile country in memory of the famous General Gordon. The consecration is to take place the latter part of this month and will be attended with splendid ceremonies. The Bishop of London, the Rt. Rev. W. Ingham-Ingram, will officiate.

### LANGUAGE OF THE ELEPHANT

Elephants are said to make use of a great variety of sounds in communicating with each other, and in expressing their wants and feelings. Some are uttered by the trunk, some by the throat. The conjunctions in which either means of expression is employed cannot be strictly classified, as fear, pleasure, wants and other emotions are sometimes indicated by the trunk, sometimes by the throat. An elephant rushing upon an assailant trumpets shrilly with fury.

Fear is similarly expressed in a shrill, brassy trumpet, or by a roar from the lungs. Pleasure by a continued low squeaking through the trunk or an almost inaudible purring sound from the throat. Want—as a calf calling its mother is chiefly expressed by the throat. A peculiar sound is made use of by elephants to express dislike or apprehension, and at the same time to intimidate, as when the cause of some alarm has not been clearly ascertained and the animals wish to deter an intruder. It is produced by rapping the end of the trunk smartly on the ground, a current of air hitherto retained being sharply emitted through the trunk as from a valve, at the moment of impact. The sound made resembles that of a large sheet of tin rapidly doubled. It has been erroneously ascribed by some writers to the animals beating their sides with their trunks.
