NE TEMERE PANIC  
ELECTED THE TORIES

(Ottawa Press Press)

Premier Borden and his colleagues have declared that the panic in Ontario over the ne temere decree is based on a false interpretation of the scope and effect of that decree.

Premier Borden, his Minister of Finance, and his Minister of Justice announce their agreement with Sir Wilfrid Laurier and Sir Allen Aylesworth that the ne temere decree does not affect the civil marriage law in Ontario or any other province.

Premier Borden and his colleagues owe their ascendancy to the panic over the ne temere that was systematically treated in Ontario by their supporters—a panic that resulted in the almost complete annihilation of the Liberal party in that province.

The official returns show that omitting the Ontario vote, the Liberals had a popular majority all over Canada of 18,391. In Ontario the Conservatives had an abnormal popular majority, due to the panic, of 62,852.

Having wrested the prize from their opponents, the new Conservative government makes a complete volte face, repudiates the anarchists who threw the bomb that gave it power, and takes on the cloak of holy righteousness.

Toronto, Jan. 30—A huge anti-home rule demonstration will be held in Toronto some time in February.

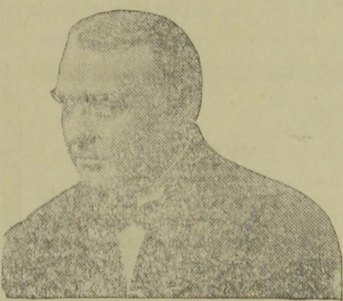
