Victoria is not noted as a live SMALL COST TO SUBSCRIBERS. stock county, but rather as a producer of grain of high quality. There are about two hundred telephones on the several lines radiating from Oakwood, and the central switch-board is in a house in the village. Each farmer installs his own instrument at a cost varying from \$20 to \$30 according to the length of the wire and the number of poles necessary to reach his house. After that the average subscription cost is from \$2 to \$10 per annum. It seldom reaches the higher figure. The regular subscription charge is \$2 per annum to cover the cost of the operation. Each farmer pays his share of maintenance and keeps his own telephone in repair. If there is anything left over at the end of the year it goes into the contingent fund.
