Toronto, Aug. 3.—John Dunn, a contractor was killed and three other persons narrowly escaped death when the underpinning of a house at No. 20 Salem Ave. under which Dunn was excavating for a cellar gave way yesterday allowing the house to fall into the excavation and pinned Dunn beneath its ruins.

Thomas Boston, owner of the house was in a room on the top floor. He fled over broken floors and stairways filled with plaster and gained the front door just as the building collapsed.

Christiania, Aug. 4.—King Haakon VII reached his fortieth birthday anniversary today, having been born, August 3, 1872. He is the second son of the late King Frederick VII of Denmark. Since he was elected to the crown by the Norwegian people in 1905 he has steadily grown in the favor of his adopted people. The King's popularity among the Norwegian people is shared to the fullest extent by the Queen who before her marriage was Princess Maud of Wales, daughter of the late King Edward VII.

Seagist, N. J., Aug. 2.—Formal announcement was made today by Governor Wilson that he will not resign the governorship of New Jersey during his campaign for the presidency. Leading Democrats in the state however, have urged him to follow the precedent of Grover Cleveland, who was nominated for the presidency but continued in the office of governor of New York.

FIRE LOSSES LIGHT

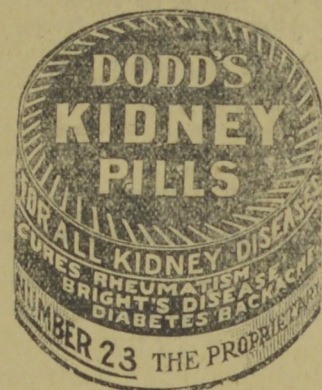
DURING LAST MONTH

Toronto, Aug. 2.—The Monetary Times estimate of Canada's fire loss during July amounted to \$1,741,331 compared with the June loss of \$1,229,112 and \$5,384,300 for the corresponding period last year. The following is the estimate of the July losses:

Fire exceeding \$10,000, \$1,387,000; small fires, \$127,806; estimates for unreported fires, \$226,483; total \$1,741,331.

The total fire losses for 1912 are \$16,481,870. The total losses for 1911 were \$21,459,575, and for 1910 they were \$23,593,315.

There were nine fatalities from fire during the month.
