# FOX RANCHING ON P. E. I. IS PROVING PROFITABLE

(Montreal Star)

ACanadian industry about which comparatively little is known, yet which is of the highest importance, and one of the most profitable in the world today, is the Black Fox Indus-try, as it is carried on in Prince Ed-ward Island. Speaking with Mr. Frank H. Tuplin, who is probably one of the largest and most successful of black and silver fox breeders, a Star representative was able to glean a few interesting facts concerning the busi-ness of Fox Ranching.

There appears to be a popular mis-conception as to the difference be-tween the black and the silver fox. Actually they are one and the same, the only difference being that as the black fox gets older, his fur shows more and more traces of silver. The jet black fox pelt is always listed as silver on the London market.

Both are very valuable and fetch prices varying from \$100 to \$1,000. Red is naturally the general color of the fox all over the world, but by a careful process of selection, ex-perienced breeders have found that they can produce at will any color de-sired. The life of the ordinary fox is about twelve years, and they will breed till they are nine. They can be raised in almost any part of Canada and may be in some of the Northern States, but the climate of Prince Edward Island seems to be especially conducive to the production of the finest fur.

But the most important part of the fox industry at the present time is not in the selling of pelts on the open market, but rather in the sell-ing of live animals for breeding pur-poses. The call for breeding foxes at the present time is so great that it will take several years to supply the demand. It is probably unlikely that a single silver or black fox pelt of good quality will be sent to the London market for the next five years, this causing a great rise in the price of skins and a consequent greater call for animals for breeding purposes. After that the business will be placed

on a more regular basis, but still be extremely profitable.

## RIGHT START NECESSARY

The main thing is for those who would enter this business, to remem-ber that a right start, even if it does cost a large amount of money, is es-sential. The price of a first-class pair of breeding foxes runs as high as \$7,000 to \$8,000, but, on the other hand, the possibilities of the fox busi-ness are enormous.

On the other hand, there are many pitfalls that attend the unwary fox-breeder. Once a good pair of foxes are purchased from a successful breeder—and it is always better to go to a man who has made a success and one who is absolutely trustworthy as there are a large number of un-scrupulous men who simply make a business of fleecing beginners—the rest depends on the utmost care in the management. It might be sup-posed that fox-breeding does not re-quire very special attention, but the very reverse is the case. Even with all the good advice in the world, how-ever, every beginner must literally profit by his own experience. Still, the rewards are large enough to war-rant a great deal of trouble being taken. Great care should be exercis-ed in building the pens and in choos-ing the site. As far as possible the ranch should be away from view and the foxes allowed to live as close to nature as possible.

## ANIMALS NEED CARE

The best site is on the sunny side of a growth of maple or fir trees, and the pens should be about 30 by 10 feet, surrounded by wire, about 9 feet high, with a two feet high overhang-ing. The whole of the pens should be surrounded with a guard or out-side fence, in case any of the foxes escape from their pens. The top is not covered. All trees within en-closure are trimmed as high as a man can reach. A trench should be dug down by the side of the pen 8 feet deep and 18 inches wide with a two

Boston, Mass., Aug. 14—The "bil-lion-dollar lawn party" which Henry C. Frick, the steel magnate, is to give at his Prides Crossing estate on Friday night of this week, promises to establish a new high-water mark for lavish entertainment among the North Shore Colony, whose summer residents include many of the wealth-iest and most prominent families in all sections of the country. Except-ing President Taft, every man pres-ent will be a millionaire, and the en-tire affair will be conducted on a scale of magnificence calculated to make the old New Englanders gasp with wonder.

A Nahant contracting firm has sig-ned a contract which obliges them to lay a smooth and perfect dancing floor on the Frick lawn between the hours of 7 and 9 on Friday evening and to take it up again between the hours of 1 and 3 on the following morning. This contract is typical of all the arrangements that have been made for the fete. It is Mr. Frick's intention that his lawn shall present its usually orderly and well-kept ap-pearance at dark on Friday evening and again at daybreak on Saturday morning, but for the four hours be-tween 9 p. m. and 1 a. m. it will be transformed into a fairland.
