TO HONOR MEMORY OF NOTED OARSMAN

Toronto, Ont., March 12—A memorial monument to the late Edward Hanlan, for many years champion oarsman of the world, is proposed at Hanlan's Point, where an unused tall chimney of the Toronto Ferry Company stands. This chimney could be covered with concrete and finished in marble dust so as to make it an imposing monument and the cost would be about \$10,000. A figure of the late famous oarsman would be placed on the top.

ICE BOAT CREWS MAY HAVE BEEN LOST

Erie, Pa., March 12—It is feared that two ice boats, each with a crew of four men, have been lost in Lake Erie. They left Cleveland yesterday morning in an attempt to make Erie in record breaking time and nothing has been heard of them since they passed Conneaut, Ohio. It is thought they raced into one of the open spots in the ice. Searching parties are being organized here.

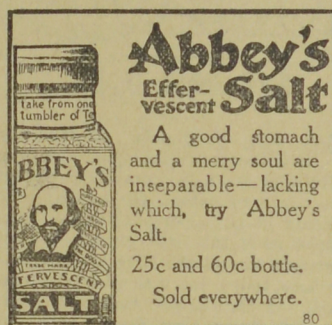

EASTERN CANADA HAS BIG FUTURE

"A great industrial awakening is taking place in the east," says Mr. C. L. Sibley, in Industrial Canada. "The secret of this awakening is that capitalists have suddenly discovered the industrial resources of these provinces. Money is pouring in, from Great Britain, from the United States, from Germany and from France, for the industrial development of Eastern Canada. Great steel and coal industries are being built up on the shores of the Atlantic Ocean, and during the past five years these industries have begun to compete in the markets of the world."

Great pulp and paper factories are springing up in New Brunswick and Quebec, which are exporting their products to all parts of the world. Mining industries are being established all over the east and Quebec, where great mineral resources have remained almost untouched while those of Ontario have been developed, has now entered into the van of progress, a result of a complete revision of her mining laws.

These are only a few of the great basic industries. Hundreds of others are following in their wake. The east in fact, is taking the place that nature has fitted her to take—that of a great manufacturing country.

DeMURRES FILED IN CONSPIRACY CASE

Indianapolis, Mar. 12—Demurrers to indictments against forty-six defendants in the government's prosecution of the alleged dynamiting conspiracy were filed before Judge A. B. Anderson by counsel for the indicted men when they were arraigned in the federal court today. Eight of the 54 defendants were not present.

E. Zoline, of Chicago, one of the attorneys for the defence, began argument in support of a motion to quash the indictments on the ground that many of them charged the same offence of conspiracy to transport explosives from state to state illegally.

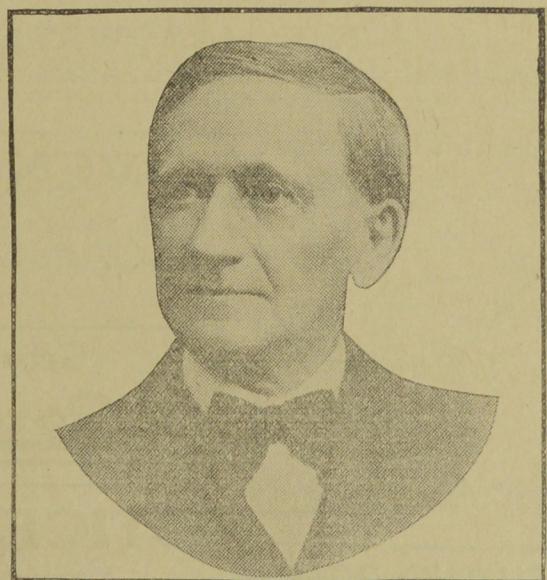
