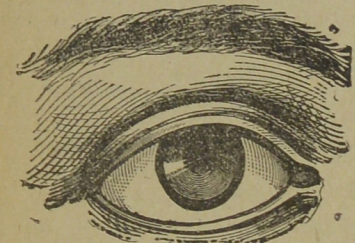

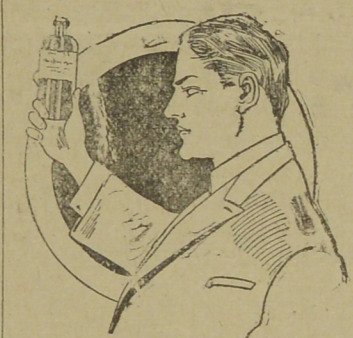

Fredericton Won York County Championship in Joke Game

Score was 16 to 9 at End of Three Periods of Poor Hockey—Referee Penalized Heavily and had Three Fredericton men off Ice at one time—Mike Murphy was in Game and Figured Prominently in Scoring

The local hockey season closed rather ingloriously last night Fredericton defeating Marysville Crescents 16 to 9 in three periods of pretty poor hockey. The game was of the sixteen variety and did tend to popularize that type of hockey. Mike Murphy and Galloway were the big noise as far as scoring was concerned. Walker and Pond also played well for Fredericton. Marysville's whole team did not play as well as it has the forwards being off color and the defense giving Fredericton lots of chances. The local team put the game safely on ice in the third period when the contest developed into a joke to which Referee McElman added special features. At one time he had three Fredericton men in the penalty box. The result of the game gives Fredericton the York County Championship.

FIRST PERIOD.

Crescent forwards got away and took play to the Fredericton end. Walker took the rubber to the other end, only to have it brought back. Mike Murphy was penalized. Marysville kept Fredericton busy, Robertson finally scoring.

 From the face of the rubber went to Murphy, who went through the Crescents and scored.

 Hughes was penalized. Pond had to make some stops. Fredericton got busy. Galloway got through and shot and Pugh scored on the rebound.

 Half a minute afterward Mike Murphy repeated his previous performance and tied the score.

 MacMorris scored for Crescents a minute afterward, after a rush by the forwards.

 Fredericton kept the play at the Crescents' end for a time but Fred Wade finally got away on a long dodging rush, and shot from the side. The shot was a long one but found the net.

Fredericton got away with a rush. Galloway scored in twenty seconds.

 Game went from end to end. Murphy shot but Robertson stopped. Walker was penalized. A man short, Fredericton was hard pressed. Murphy ran down but shot wide. Pond was called on to make a stop after a rush by the Crescent forwards. Galloway took the rubber down single-handed, and scored.

 Irvine Wade replaced Robertson at centre. Galloway got through again but Robertson stopped his shot. Marysville got away on a long rush and Brogan scored.

 Thirty seconds afterward Murphy scored for Fredericton, after rushing through the Marysville team.

Marysville, 6; Fredericton, 7.
 The puck was lost at this point and there was a long wait while another was being procured. Brogan ran through but Pond stopped his shot. Play was fairly lively. From the Fredericton end Galloway ran down the side and scored on a long shot.

Marysville, 6; Fredericton, 8.
 Fredericton kept the Crescents busy for a while. Fred Wade got away on a long rush but Walker took the rubber back. Play went from end to end with both teams slashing and roughing things up. Brogan got chased by the referee. A man short, Crescents played rings around Fredericton and Fred Wade scored.

THIRD PERIOD.

In the third period, Referee McElman pulled off some weird stunts of refereeing and at one time had three Fredericton men off the ice at one time. The Fredericton team scored with monotonous regularity, and made the score 10 to 7 before Marysville scored at all. Irvine Wade tallied once after which Fredericton began to score again and made the tally 16 to 8. Fred Wade scored Marysville's last goal. The puck went back to Robinson in the Marysville net, who rushed down the ice and shot. Nobody saw just where the puck went and the game ended there.
