The reports of the four chief game wardens appointed by the government show that many big game animals were killed in the province last year. In the counties of Restigouche, Gloucester and Northumberland 687 moose 240 caribou and 743 deer fell before the hunters' rifles. In the Counties of Albert, King's, Kent and Westmorland the number was 516 moose and 608 deer. In Carleton, Victoria, Charlotte and Madawaska the totals were 289 moose, 8 caribou and 240 lieer, while in York, Sunbury, Queens and 619 deer bit the dust. The totals are 2,132 moose, 266 caribou and 240 deer. These returns will no doubt astonish sportsmen.
