ARMY TO CUT PAY OF DRINKING MEN

Seattle, Wash., Nov. 25.—In pursuance of a provision in the Army Appropriation bill inserted at the urgent request of the military authorities, a new regulation for the government of the military authorities now. The regulation reads: "Any of 3ccr or enlisted man who shall be absent from duty on account of disease resulting from his own intemperate use of drugs or alcoholic liquors or other misconduct shall forfeit his pay for the period during which he is unable to perform his regular duties."

This is carrying into effect in the army the rule which prevails in civil life and in the business world says the Seattle Post Intelligencer. It might be adopted to advantage in all of the departments of the government in which liberal allowances for "sick leave" are now the rule.

Heretofore in the cases of enlisted men they have been fined by summary court martial for drunkenness which disabled them for duty. In aggravated cases officers have been brought to court martial and have suffered loss of rank or dismissal from the service. Where no public scandal has been attached and where the offences have not been public or flagrant no punishment has followed. An officer disabled from duty through any of his weaknesses has been trusted in the military hospitals and his absence from duty excused as a matter of course.

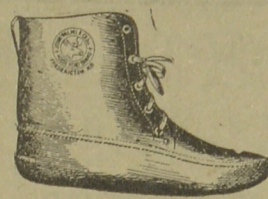
CANADA BECOMING BRAVELY JINGOSTIC

London, Nov. 25.—In The Chronicle today T. J. Baker, who has just spent three months in Canada, declares that "although it is a horrid thought, there is too much evidence that the English Tory, the Canadian Tory, the Canadian manufacturer and the American trust king have combined together in making investment money a lung power for the exploitation of the British flag."

"They preach the flag in every form," says Mr. Baker, "from licking Germany to 'no truck or trade with the Yankees.' They know well enough that to keep passion at white heat and prejudice in the ascendant is the only way to beat reciprocity and, as they think, to keep intact their protective tariff against the American producer. The intrigue has achieved a measure of success."

"Canada," Mr. Baker argues, "is becoming bravely jingostic. The people nearly all forget that since the Dominion achieved self-government she has reaped no benefit from the British fleet because there have been no enemies to protect her from. They never dream that the British fleet has been trebled in a dozen years to satisfy the moloch of war. They never realize that they have no 'debt' because they have been paying taxes for the development of Canada's material resources and so building up a power of empire more truly than a world of dreadnaughts ever could."
