### TITLES THAT APPEAR IN THE WAR NEWS

Washington, D. C., Nov. 6.—An attack on the Turkish Embassy here contains the following information concerning Ottoman titles to aid American readers in digesting the news from the seat of war in the East. To begin with, it must be understood that all the American prefixes "Mr.," "General," "Governor," etc., suffixes in Turkey, the title following the name of the individual instead of preceding it.

A Caliph ranks next to the Sultan, being a prince of the royal line, with the added distinction of being "Mahomet's representative."

Next, in the Turkish religion, comes Chek-ul-Islam, on the head of the Mahometan faith.

Imam is the title by which a priest is commonly addressed.

Pasha is the highest title within the gift of the sultan. It is bestowed chiefly upon men who attain distinction in the arts or commerce.

The word "Bey" affixed to a Turkish surname signifies that the wearer is distinguished in the service of the state.

The term "Efendi" implies that the man so addressed is superior to the average man in birth, breeding and education, although not of the same rank as a "Bey."

The Grand Vizier, or Sadorazam, is the premier of the cabinet and the highest of the government civil officials.

The governor of a province is addressed as Vali, while the mayor of a city affixes to his name Beledie Raisi.

## POINTED OBSERVATIONS FROM ANOTHER RATEPAYER

To The Editor of The Daily Mail

Dear Sir:—Some weeks ago The Mail published a letter from Revd. Mr. Colter, dealing in a mild way, with some phases of the Liquor problem.

This communication served only to emphasize the fact that for months past not a voice has been raised either in pulpit, on the platform or in the press, by clergymen or laymen concerning what has frequently been spoken of as the most vital question connected with civic government.

Apparently the agitation from the prohibition and temperance standpoint, has received its quietus, and all the valiant champions of former days have meekly decided to recognize the fact that the Citizens' Ticket and its system of law enforcement reign triumphant. The Good Government party, leaders rank and file has retired shamefacedly from the field.

Needless to say that the hotels and bar rooms are reaping a rich harvest and the bigger the hotel and the more it is patronized by the magnates, provincial and dominion, the bigger the harvest, while the law is being enforced by periodical first offence fines, upon nameless hotel proprietors (complaints laid by our trusty and ever alert policemen) and by the imposition of the usual \$8 and \$10 fines upon the miserable unfortunate drunkards haled before the Police Magistrate, who, we are blandly informed generally get their booze at Woodstock or St. John and are caught by the Fredericton policemen on their arrival here by train.

Recognizing that this is the way the people want the Scott Act administered, it was not surprising to read in a local paper recently a letter from a tax payer suggesting that it was "time for the citizens to look at Civic affairs from some other point than Scott Act and Anti-Scott Act," and in fact that civic politics might very properly be run on the question whether the Kitchen family are properly assessed or not. As an argument towards decision of this weighty and important feature of the proposed new Civic Platform, the statement was made that one brother of the Kitchen family was on one side of civic politics and the other brother is on the other side.

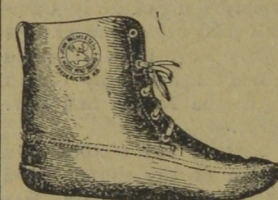

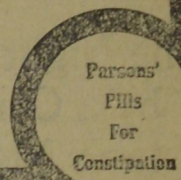

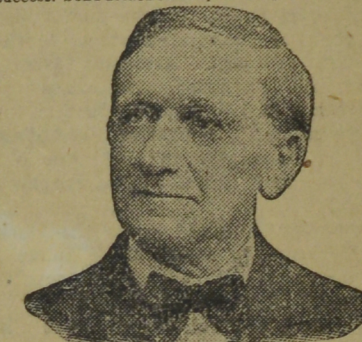
